#### **Message From Thack**

#### The Gift of Growing Older

I turned 70 this year. I suppose that officially makes me "old"—though I confess, I don't feel it. For 20 years I've been eligible for the AARP discount at restaurants, hotels, and movie theaters, yet I never once thought of myself as old. Somehow the two didn't seem related.

But now, with the big 7-0 behind me, I've realized something important: aging isn't about what we lose—it's about what we gain. Each new stage of life, even those that arrive with creaky knees, new prescriptions, or an ever-growing stack of birthday cards from AARP itself, brings with it fresh opportunities.

When I was younger, I thought of transitions as hurdles—graduations, new jobs, and new places to live. But looking back, I see that each stage was really a doorway into new possibilities. Aging is no different. Yes, we may move a little slower, or need brighter light to read the Prayer Book, but we also gain wisdom, perspective, and, best of all, a growing ability to laugh at ourselves.

The truth is, I am standing on the threshold of a couple of significant transitions over the next two years. Both will shape my life in profound ways. Yet I do not anticipate them with dread. Instead, I face them with cautious optimism, trusting that God still has big plans for me. If the past has taught me anything, it is that God is faithful in every season, and each new chapter—no matter how unexpected—can be filled with His grace.

The Book of Proverbs reminds us that "Gray hair is a crown of glory; it is gained in a righteous life" (Proverbs 16:31). What the world may see as a mark of age, Scripture sees as a blessing—evidence of God's faithfulness across the years and a visible sign of a life well lived.

When you examine it closely, life with God has never been about standing still. From Abraham and Sarah in their twilight years, to ancient Simeon and Anna who greeted the infant Christ in the Temple, Scripture reminds us that God delights in working through people at every stage of life. No one ever really "ages out" of being useful in the Kingdom.

So, I've decided to embrace this next chapter with gratitude. To this end I will laugh at the quirks of aging (because humor, like grace, is good medicine). I will be curious about what God still has in store. And I will be mindful of the fact that every gray hair, every wrinkle, and every step forward is a promise that God isn't done with me yet.

As we grow older together, let's live not with regret for what is behind us, but with hope for what lies ahead. Each season of life—yes, even this one—brims with promise and possibility. And besides, if aging means getting a discount at your favorite coffee shop, I say, let's raise a cup and celebrate!

#### THE DREAM CENTER OF BALDWIN COUNTY

The Dream Center is another non-profit that St. Paul's Thrift Shop is proud to support with our annual profit give-away. The Dream Center serves disadvantaged youth (ages 12-18) in Baldwin County by providing support through education, advocacy and mentorship - ensuring that children have access to basic physical, emotional and financial resources. Their goal is to prepare at risk young people for long term success by teaching them that life's dreams can be attained through hard work, focus and direction. The program focuses on diversion techniques which redirect participants away from delinquent behavior and help them improve interactions with peers and authority figures, in school and at home. The Dream Center partners with the Baldwin County Juvenile Justice system and area schools to help break the cycle of abuse, victimization and criminality by providing mentoring, conflict resolution training, drug and alcohol education and accountability, classroom tutoring and homework assistance, financial assistance for clothing needs and extra-curricular activities, a food pantry, work force readiness and college application assistance. The Dream Center is directed by Pastor Joe Aldrete, Lead Chaplain at the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office and Senior Pastor of Calvary Chapel. In April, 2025, a ground breaking ceremony was held at Calvary Chapel on County Rd. 24 for the new, permanent Dream Center of Baldwin County. 



# For the Right Use of God's Gifts BCP, p827

Almighty God, whose loving hand has given us all that we possess: Grant us grace that we may honor you with our substance, and, remembering the account which we must one day give, may be faithful stewards of your bounty, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Every Sunday we proclaim our belief in the words of the Nicene Creed, "We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen." The creed goes on to say, "Through him all things were made."

Stating – and believing – this creed puts on all of us a responsibility to take care of everything God has given us by his loving hand. That is everything: the flora, fauna, the earth itself, and our fellow humans. Sometimes it's easier to throw that plastic bottle into the garbage, where it will end up in a landfill, rather than put it in the recycle bin. (Or better still, avoid the plastic bottle altogether!) Sometimes it's easier to ignore the public notice about a new development that will destroy acres of trees rather than attend a public meeting and respectfully voice concern. And sometimes it's much easier to avoid a beggar on the corner of the highway, who will likely be sleeping on a bench tonight, than to roll down the window and give him or her a bag of food, or a couple of dollars.

No, throwing one plastic bottle in the trash will not solve the problem of larger and larger garbage dumps. No, attending the public meeting probably won't stop the new development. No, giving the beggar a bag of food or a few dollars will not solve his or her problems. So why bother?

Bother, because we believe that everything is from God. Everything is sacred. The current Great Wednesday sessions are based on an uplifting book by Barbara Brown Taylor, *The Altar in the World: A Geography of Faith*, where, in gentle and beautiful prose, she encourages us to hold everything sacred.

Let us all practice the words of our belief by paying attention to those things we can do to reverence God's creation, that is, everything.

- You may freeze ahead if baking 3 or more days prior to . Weekend but be sure they are totally defrosted before placing them in the sturdy container used to transport.
- Use a sturdy container to transport to Weekend or to the team member taking to Weekend. Cardboard boxes are ok to use. If using a plastic container that you want back be sure to put your name on it for Team Member to return to you.
