Message From Thack

This Saturday, the Church throughout the world celebrates All Saints' Day—a feast of remembrance, thanksgiving, and hope. We pause to honor that "great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb" (Revelation 7:9). It is a vision of heaven overflowing with joy, where every tear is wiped away and all who have gone before us rest in the eternal presence of God.

All Saints' Day reminds us that the Communion of Saints is far larger than the names printed in calendars or carved into stained glass. It includes the apostles and martyrs, yes—but it also includes the people whose lives have touched ours personally: those who mentored us in the faith, who showed us love, who prayed for us, and whose steady witness pointed us toward Christ.

This year, our celebration feels especially tender as we remember two beloved members of our parish family whom we commended to God just last week: Elaine Glover and Marie Catherine "Kit" Caffey.

Elaine was known for her grace, kindness, and the quiet strength of her faith. She had a way of listening that made you feel heard and valued—a reflection of the God who hears us all. Kit's generous spirit and joy were unmistakable; she blessed others simply by being present, sharing laughter, and lending a helping hand wherever it was needed. Kit's love of history led to her helping to preserve the Diocesan and local congregations' archives.

Both women lived their faith in such a way that Christ's love shone through them. They are what All Saints' Day is all about—ordinary people through whom God's extraordinary grace flowed. Their legacy is not only in the memories we hold dear, but in the example they continue to set for us. They still speak to us, reminding us to live with compassion, generosity, and steadfast faith.

The saints—those whose names we know and those known only to God—are part of the same great communion that surrounds us whenever we gather for worship. In our prayers, our hymns, and at the Lord's Table, heaven and earth meet, and there we are united with all who have gone before us.

So as we celebrate All Saints' Day, let us give thanks for Elaine, Kit, and all those who have shaped our lives with love and faithfulness. Let us remember that we, too, are called to be saints—not perfect, but faithful; not flawless, but willing to let God's light shine through us for the sake of others.

May their memory inspire us to live with hope, to love generously, and to follow Christ with joy—until that day when we, too, join the great multitude before the throne, singing, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits upon the throne, and to the Lamb!"

Collect for All Christians in Their Vocation BCP, p. 206

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of thy faithful people is governed and sanctified: Receive our supplications and prayers, which we offer before thee for all members of thy holy Church, that in their vocation and ministry they may truly and devoutly serve thee; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the same Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

The collect starts out so beautifully: "...by whose Spirit the whole body of thy faithful people is governed and sanctified..." That's all of us! We are so very blessed to be sanctified by the Spirit. To be sanctified means to be made holy, to be purified, to be transformed. And who but the Holy Spirit can help us with that? Carry that blessing with you every day.

Then we offer prayers for everyone in our vocation and ministries. That's all of us! Certainly we all have or have had a vocation, and **all of us** continue to be ministers. In the catechism, the question is asked: "Who are the ministers of the Church?" The answer is: "The ministers of the Church are lay persons, bishops, priests, and deacons." Notice who comes first – lay persons. Of course that makes sense, because there are many more lay persons than clergy, and it is everyone's responsibility to carry the Word into the world.

And we ask the Spirit to help all of us truly and devoutly serve God, Almighty and Everlasting, in everything we do, at all times, and in all places. When we do that, we are by our example being ministers. People see in us what they want for themselves, and that is the love and peace that come with our devotion. I met two people in just the last month who told me the reason they are strong in their faith today is because they saw in someone else that love and peace, and they wanted it too. What a beautiful thing to share – and it never runs out!

A Note From David Kielek

The following article information was taken from the book The Shroud of Turin, The Burial Cloth of Jesus Christ? by Ian Wilson, and from the article *Research Suggests Christians Right About Shroud of Turin*, published on newsmax.com on August 7, 2025

More long-held scientific hypotheses that the Shroud of Turin was a fake, or hoax, have been debunked by recent research. Johns Hopkins immunologist Dr. Kelly Kearse has found in her research that the 'washing hypothesis', long used by unbelievers to cast doubt on the authenticity of the Shroud, was incorrect. Microscopic examination of blood rings on the Shroud found by Dr. Kearse has revealed serum halos, or clear rings that form around blood clots.

"...the improbability that a forger would have added the detail of 'halos/rings' in anticipation of their eventual discovery", while not conclusive proof of the authenticity of the shroud, is another step in what I believe will eventually prove that authenticity, and is also another indication of the lengths unbelieving 'scientists' will take to cast doubt on the veracity of this holy relic.

Truly fascinating information is being uncovered on a regular basis concerning the Shroud of Turin. In my next article I will discuss new findings about the energy expended to produce the image on the Shroud; I hope you'll join me then.


