Message From Thack

War, Peace, and the Weight of Conscience

Some of you have asked me to explain the basis of the public feud between President Donald Trump and Pope Leo XVI. Essentially, it's another example of where the Church and the State sometimes have conflicting values. In this case, the recent public disagreement between the President and the Pope was over the conflict involving Iran. It has once again drawn the world's attention to a question as old as humanity itself: When, if ever, is war justified? As Christians, we do not approach that question casually. We approach it carefully and with prayerful hearts.

The Church, particularly through thinkers like Saints Augustine and Aquinas, has long wrestled with the reality that while Christ calls us to peace, we live in a world that is often anything but peaceful. Out of that tension emerged what we call the "Just War Theory." At its core, this teaching insists that war can only be justified under very strict conditions. These conditions are:

1. Wars must be fought only on *legitimate authority*.
2. The cause must be *just*. The war must be fought, for example, in order to resist aggression, protect the innocent, or to support the rights of some oppressed group. There must be significant reasons which are weighty enough to overthrow the *prima facie* duty that we should not kill or injure others.
3. The war must have *right intention*. It must advance the good and avoid evil, have clear aims and be open to negotiation; it must not be for revenge or for the sake of killing and there should be no ulterior motive. It must be waged without love of violence, or cruelty; and regret or remorse should be the proper attitude. This is shaped by the pursuit of a just cause. Since peace should be the object of war, killing is a means to that end.
4. It must be a *last resort*, after all avenues of diplomacy and reconciliation have been exhausted.

5. There must be a *reasonable hope of justice*, or a reasonable chance of success, in order to prevent pointless wars. If there is no such hope, then it would not just be imprudent, but there would be no good grounds to override the *prima facie* obligation to not harm others. If none of the just ends can be realized then going to war would be immoral.

6. There must be *discrimination*. Non-combatants should not be directly or intentionally attacked, although it is recognized that there may be accidental casualties (collateral damage).

7. There must be *proportion*; that is, there must be a balance between the good achieved versus the harm done. This condition considers the effects on all human beings, not just those on one side, and it is the effects on humans rather than other physical damage which have priority.¹

Beyond theory, we must listen to the deeper rhythm of Scripture. From the prophets who envisioned swords beaten into plowshares (Isaiah 2:4), to Jesus himself who proclaimed, “Blessed are the peacemakers” (Matthew 5:9), the biblical witness leans unmistakably toward peace.

Jesus does not glorify violence. He absorbs it. He does not call down legions of angels to do battle. He stretches out his arms on the cross.

The early Church, in its infancy, often took a radically nonviolent stance, choosing martyrdom over retaliation. While history has forced the Church to grapple with political realities, the spiritual trajectory remains clear: peace is not weakness; it is the very character of God.

One of the most sobering aspects of Just War teaching is its insistence that the threat must be actual and immediate, not hypothetical or exaggerated. History is littered with conflicts launched under the banner of “possible danger,” only to reveal later that the threat was misunderstood, overstated, or, at times, manipulated. War cannot be waged on suspicion. When fear becomes the architect of policy, truth is often its first casualty.

Equally troubling is the temptation—ancient and modern—to use war as a distraction from domestic unrest or political difficulty. The Church must speak clearly here: war must never be used as a tool of political convenience. To do so is to treat human lives as instruments rather than sacred creations of God. It is to trade the image of God in others for the illusion of control.

As Christians, we are called to pray for leaders on all sides that they act with wisdom and restraint. We are to advocate for peace whenever possible. We must also honestly recognize the tragic reality that, in rare circumstances, force may be necessary—but only under the most stringent moral scrutiny. And above all, remember that our ultimate allegiance is not to any nation, but to the Kingdom of God.

And every time we gather at the altar, we are reminded of this: the One we follow did not conquer the world through violence, but through sacrificial love.

!!Attention St. Paul's Parishioners and Ministry Leaders!!

Summer is quickly approaching and that means VBS will be here soon! I am in the planning phase right now and can see that this VBS is going to need a lot of hands to make everything possible! I want to encourage you to share your God given gifts and talents, along with our many ministries for help with oversight of each station, and ask that you pray about helping with specific stations or tasks leading up to VBS to give us a smoother and less hectic VBS experience.

I need specifically:

- A drama coach to help teach morning opening skits. This would include meeting maybe on Sunday mornings, or Sunday afternoons to teach youth helpers (3rd grade-High School) the skits for openings or closings and also working with them on the songs. You could create your own schedule to pull this team (formerly known as Music Arts and Drama Camp) together. I have the skits, but you can be creative too!
- A snack director to come up with a themed snack each day, and collaborate with me on decorating Malone Hall the days before VBS. Snack suggestions are included in our kit! We can use them, or you can be creative!
- Music Leader for opening and closing each day. Can work alongside the drama coach to encourage youth to participate with songs and learn the motions to encourage our little ones to sing and dance along! I would like to showcase a song or 2 at the 8:00 and 10:30 services the Sunday before or after VBS this year
- A Bible Adventures Director decorates and pulls together all of the necessary items for all 4 days of Bible Adventures (in Children's Chapel). Will also be in charge of decorating and doing changes for each day of Bible Adventures. Most decorations we already have, it is just coordinating and setting up for each day. This station also needs an assistant some days to dress as a character or be a helping hand for Father Thack.
- A Sticky Scripture is a video-led station that helps the kids learn the Bible verse each day. It is usually held in Malone Hall when we are not having snack. The kids have little booklets and get a figurine each day that goes along with the theme and Bible Verse of the Day.
- A Nursery Worker who will help with the little ones (ages 2 and under) in the Preschool from 8:30-12pm.
- We also need group leaders to walk around with the kids, week of (we try for 1 adult per group with 2-3 middle and high school assistants) and will be leading small groups too. I will provide all information to group leaders well in advance if I have volunteer sign ups!

We will have a Volunteer meeting scheduled soon! If you are interested in possibly serving for one of these needs, please let me know! I will be happy to give you more details and share curriculum, etc. with you!

Please pray about taking on one of these stations (you can even take on a station with others) to minister to our little ones! It's a busy and exhausting, but wonderful week and I think we can make this one the best VBS yet, together!

Our VBS is June 29- July 2, 9am-12pm this year, and our set up days will be June 22-26.

Hello again my friends: As some of you may know, we have recently been battling a water leak in one of the underground pipes at the Life Center. We are losing about 3 gallons of water per minute out this leak, so it is pretty substantial.

Yesterday we had American Leak Detection company, from Cantonment FL come to give us their expertise. It was very interesting watching Zach do his work. He had this little box with various dials and gauges on it, a pair of headphones attached to it, along with a long thin iron rod that he stuck in the ground at various points, while he put on the headphones, fiddled with the dials and listened. That went on for some time with little success. Next he wheeled out a heavy bottle of compressed air and hooked it up to one of the water valves in the kitchen of the Life Center. How he knew to hook it up to this particular one I don't know, but he blew compressed air through that valve; you can see the results in the attached picture. We are looking forward to having them back to fix the leak in the near future.



In other news, the Exceptional Foundation had their Spring Break last week, April 13-16. We used this interval to repair various light fixtures around the campus. Still to be completed (Thursday, hopefully) is one of the large street light type fixtures just outside the front door of the Life Center. It will take a bucket truck to get to it.

Don't forget the parish breakfast, sponsored by the St. Paul's Men's Club, is coming up a week from this Sunday, May 3rd, beginning after the 8 AM service. This is always a fun and delicious event, and a chance to share fellowship with our parishioners. I hope you will all come out and enjoy the eggs, sausage/bacon, grits, fruit and biscuits!

Also, don't forget our monthly bingo sessions, another very fun event! Upcoming dates include Friday, May 22nd, June 26th and July 24th. Proceeds go to help retire the debt on the Howard Wilson Life Center. Hope to see you there!

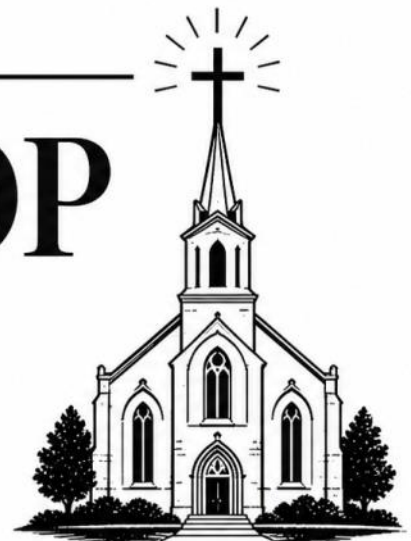
