## **Blessing of the Animals, Sunday, October 6**

The Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi is October 4. Born in Italy on or about 1182, Saint Francis of Assisi was the son of a rich cloth merchant and developed a reputation as a partying playboy in his youth. After fighting in a battle between the City States of Assisi and Perugia, Francis was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison — awaiting his father's payment of his ransom— and, according to legend, began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, Francis heard the voice of Christ, who told him to repair the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. Consequently, he abandoned his privileged life and became a devotee of the faith. Because of his life and work with the poor, Francis' reputation soon spread all over the Christian world.

Later in life, Francis reportedly received a vision that left him with the stigmata of Christ. These were marks resembling the wounds Jesus Christ suffered when he was crucified. Francis was the first person to receive such holy wounds. He was canonized a saint on July 16, 1228. During his life he also developed a deep love of nature and animals and is known as the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals the world over are blessed on or near his feast day.

We will observe the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi this Sunday, October 6 at 4:00 p.m. with our annual blessing of the animals. Please gather in the church courtyard between Malone Hall and the church by 4:00 for the blessing. All animals, amphibians, reptiles and aquatic life are invited to be blessed.

## **What do we offer for your children at St. Paul's?**

### **Ages 0-3/4 years old**

Nursery is available from 4:45-6:00 pm every Saturday and 7:45 am-12:00 pm every Sunday for our services, over in the Life Center. We also have a nursery during Great Wednesday at 6 in McCann Hall.

### **Pre-k 4 -3<sup>rd</sup> grade -**
