The Annual Meeting of the Parish is Sunday, November 16, 2025 at 9:15 a.m. in Malone Hall. We will elect 4 new members to the vestry and 5 delegates to the Diocesan Convention. Your presence, input and vote are important. The names and other information about the nominees is included in this Tentmaker. Annual reports will be distributed at the meeting. Please note the following election procedure: voting shall be by ballot of those communicants in good standing over the age of sixteen and present at the meeting. To be a member in good standing means, among other things, one is a confirmed member in the Episcopal Church. No absentee ballots will be accepted.

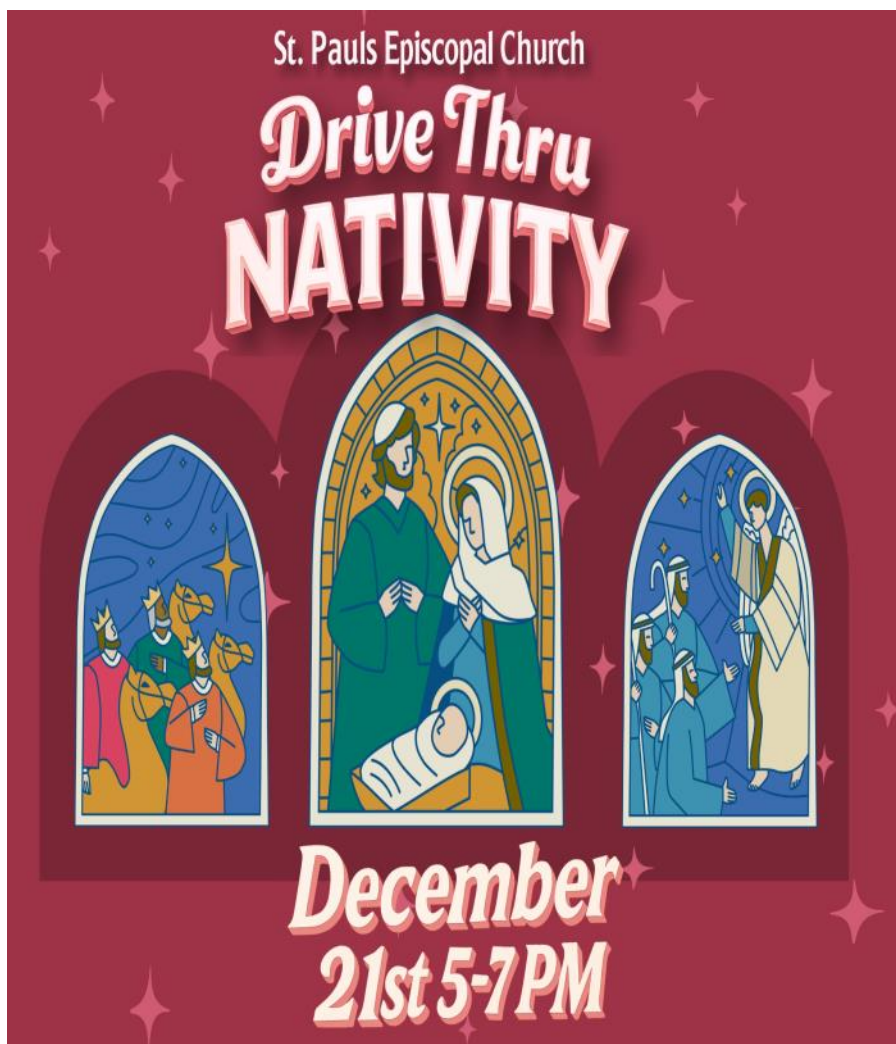


As we enter this joyful season, the St. Paul's Choir is preparing for two beautiful musical services to mark the beginning of Advent.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who settest the solitary in families: We commend to thy continual care the homes in which thy people dwell. Put far from them, we beseech thee, every root of bitterness, the desire of vainglory, and the pride of life. Fill them with faith, virtue, knowledge, temperance, patience, godliness. Knit together in constant affection those who, in holy wedlock, have been made one flesh. Turn the hearts of the parents to the children, and the hearts of the children to the parents; and so enkindle fervent charity among us all, that we may evermore be kindly and affectioned one to another; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thanksgiving is one of my favorite holidays. There are no gifts, no mega commercialism associated with it, and not a ton of preparation, even if I am the one hosting. Thanksgiving is a time to appreciate family and friends, to gather around the table, be it lavish or humble, and – if you’re so inclined – to watch football. A Note From David Kielek

The Shroud of Turin: A Hoax, or the Burial Cloth of Jesus Christ? The Catholic Church has never officially ruled on the Shroud's authenticity, preferring to allow that judgments regarding it's age and origin are best left to scientific inquiry.

Recent scientific study, for example a dating process involving Wide-Angle X-Ray Scattering (WAXS) conducted by Italy's Institute of Crystallography in 2024 determined that the Shroud appears to consistently date as a 2000-year-old relic; microscopic analysis has found pollens on the relic that are only found in the region of Jerusalem. X-ray dating methods put the Shroud's origin in the time of Jesus.

The image on the shroud has never been replicated before, and “is not art”.

Various attempts have been made, all unsuccessful, to replicate and/or explain how a “forgery” of the Shroud could have been produced. There are many unanswered questions concerning this holy relic, but as of now modern science, always skeptical of matters which might indicate something greater than mankind, is at a loss to determine a “natural” explanation for the creation of the holy Shroud.

French historian Jean-Christian Petitfils is unequivocal: he has studied the Shroud extensively over many years, and has concluded it's authenticity can no longer be disputed.
