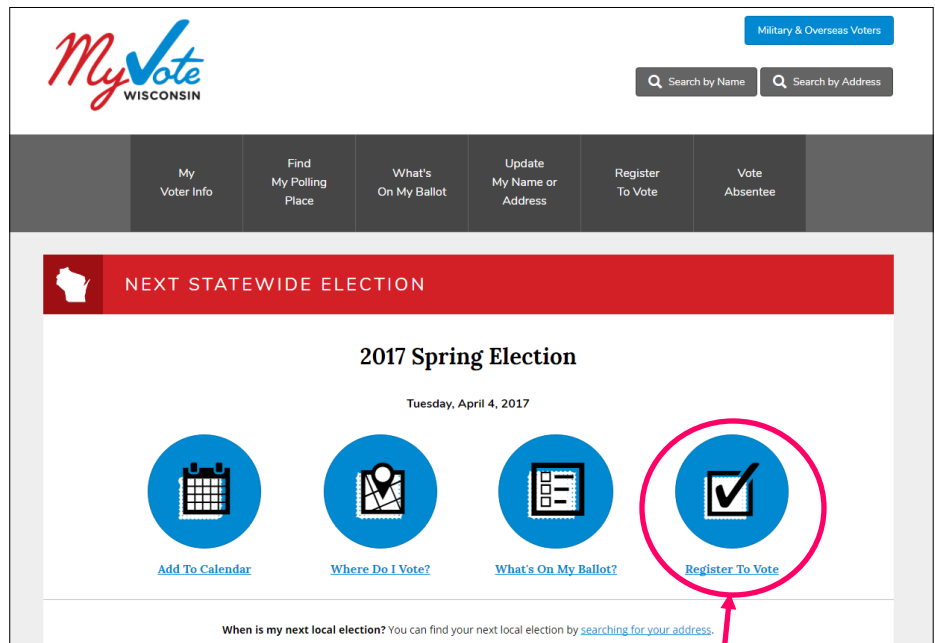

This website has the answers to ALL your questions about voting in Wisconsin.

Please be advised—you will have to enter your **name and date of birth** to access your “voter info,” and you will find:

- Whether or not you are registered to vote
- Current registered name and address (and the ability to update)
- Date of next election
- Polling place
- A clickable button for requesting an absentee ballot
- Your voting activity
- Your municipal clerk
- A list of your current elected officials



Entering your **address** will access:

- Find My Polling Place
- Where Do I Vote, and
- What's on my Ballot

Registration is the first step! Click on “[Register to Vote](#)” for detailed information about how to register to vote in Wisconsin.



Photo ID Required for Voting:

This website has all the information you need to know about the photo ID law in Wisconsin.

In order to **register** to vote, you need proof of residence and photo ID. Both requirements can be met with a current WI driver's license. If you don't have this, check the website for what works.

In order to **cast a ballot**, you need a photo ID that meets the requirements (WI driver's license, U.S. passport, etc.). See website for all acceptable forms of photo ID.

Make Voting Easy

Look at your calendar! What will you be doing on Tuesday, April 4, 2017?

- Will you be on Spring Break?
- Do you have to get your kids to daycare?
- Do you have meetings scheduled?
- Is your “normal,” every day schedule completely unpredictable?

If going to your polling place to cast your ballot between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm on Election Day will pose some scheduling problems for you, there are several ways you can **make voting easier!**

Vote Early

You can **vote in person** at your municipal clerk’s office **beginning Monday, March 20, 2017**, during regular business hours. Contact your municipal clerk for details about dates and times. Find your municipal clerk on myvote.wi.gov (see other side of this flyer for details).

Request a mail-in absentee ballot

You can request that an absentee ballot be mailed to you for this election or EVERY election. Even if you choose to vote in person on any given election, you can just take your unused absentee ballot to the polls and vote in person instead of mailing in your absentee ballot. Go to myvote.wi.gov to request an absentee ballot or download and mail this [application](#).

Important Dates

- **March 20, 2017**
Early voting begins in-person at your municipal clerk’s office
- **March 30, 2017**
5:00 pm—a request for an absentee ballot must be received in the clerk’s office
- **March 31, 2017**
Last day for in-person early voting
- **April 4, 2017**
Election Day
