Am I registered to vote? Where do I vote? Where is my municipal clerk's office? When and where can I vote early? How do I request an absentee ballot?

Proof of residence and photo ID are required for voter registration. The two things can be accomplished with a single WI driver's license that has your current address on it.

Are you unable to vote at your polling place on Election Day? Take advantage of one of these other options:

Receive your ballot by mail

Wisconsin voters can receive their absentee ballot by mail. If you are a regular voter who would like to vote in the 2016 General Election, make sure to submit your request for an absentee ballot by November 3, 2016. Request an Absentee Ballot

Vote early in your Municipal Clerk's office

Starting the third Monday before Election Day, you can vote by absentee ballot in person at your Municipal Clerk's office. For the November 8th election, EARLY VOTING is Monday, October 24th through Friday, November 4th. As a result of recent court decisions, early voting may be expanded in certain areas. Receive a ballot for every election by mail

If you are unable to go to your polling place on Election Day due to age, illness, disability or infirmity, you can request an absentee ballot be sent to you for every election, automatically, as an "indefinitely confined elector." Request Automatic Absentee Ballots

Deadlines for the November 8, 2016 General Election

Voter Registration- Deadlines for November 8, 2016 Election

Voters can register in the following ways. All voters must provide a <u>Proof of Residence</u> document when registering to vote.

October 19, 2016- *Deadline to Register by Mail* Your voter registration form, along with <u>proof of residence</u> must be postmarked to your <u>municipal clerk</u> no later than October 19, 2016. <u>Find your Municipal Clerk's Contact Information</u> here.

November 4, 2016 @ 5:00 p.m.- *Deadline to Register in Your Municipal Clerk's Office* Voters may <u>register</u> in-person in their municipal clerk's office during the clerk's business hours until 5:00 p.m. on November 4, 2016. <u>Find your Municipal Clerk's Contact Information here.</u>

November 8, 2016- *Register to Vote at Your Polling Place* Voters can <u>register to vote</u> at their polling place on Election Day, November 8, 2016. Find your Polling Place here.

Absentee Voting- Deadlines for November 8, 2016 Election All voters in Wisconsin can request an absentee ballot be mailed to them for any reason. Voters must be registered before they can request an absentee ballot. Voters may request their absentee ballot in writing. To request an absentee ballot on MyVote.wi.gov click here. You must provide a photo ID with your absentee ballot request, more information on photo ID can be found here.

November 3, 2016 @ **5:00 p.m.-** *Deadline to Request an Absentee Ballot- Regular and Permanent Overseas Voters* If you are a regular or a <u>Permanent Overseas voters</u>, your <u>absentee ballot request</u> must be received by your <u>municipal clerk</u> no later than 5:00 p.m. on November 3, 2016.

November 4, 2016 @ **5:00** p.m.- Deadline to Request an Absentee Ballot- Indefinitely Confined and Military (not away) If a voter is <u>indefinitely confined</u> or is in the <u>military</u> (but is not away from home on active duty) then your absentee ballot request must be received by your municipal clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on November 4, 2016.

October 24 - November 4, 2016 @ 7:00 p.m.- Deadline for In-Person Absentee Voters can request and vote an absentee ballot in-person in their municipal clerk's office between October 24 through 7:00 p.m. on November 4, 2016. Office hours vary by municipality. Please contact your municipal clerk for absentee voting hours.

November 8, 2016 @5:00 p.m.- *Deadline for Hospitalized Voters* Voters who are in a hospital may <u>request a ballot</u> be brought to them by an appointed agent if they are hospitalized in the 7 days preceding the election. Hospitalized elections may request an absentee ballot between November 1, 2016 and November 8, 2016 at 5:00 p.m.

November 8, 2016 @ 5:00 p.m.- *Deadline for Military Voters (Away) to Request an Absentee Ballot* Voters who are in the <u>military</u> and are away from their home for active duty may request an absentee ballot through 5:00 p.m. on November 8. Military voters may also receive their absentee ballot electronically.

November 8, 2016 @ **8:00** p.m.- *Deadline to Return Absentee Ballot* If you have already received an absentee ballot, you must return your absentee ballot to your <u>municipal clerk</u>. Your ballot must be received by your municipal clerk no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 8, 2016.
