2018 WEAC PAC Automatic Flags:

In AD 9, Josh Zepnick (D) – the Assembly Democratic Caucus has indicated there will be a primary in AD9 because Representative Zepnick, who has a 100% percent voting record, is not resigning.

In AD 12, Representative Fred Kessler (D), who has a 100% voting record, has two democratic primary opponents.

In AD 15, Joe Sanfelippo (R) has an 80% voting record because he voted no on the state budget.

In AD 22, Janel Brandtjen (R) has an 80% voting record because she voted no on the state budget.

In AD 44, Debra Kolste (D) has a 15% voting record because she did not vote on 3 of the 4 bills that were weighted.

In AD 66, Representative Greta Neubauer (D) has a 40% voting record. Representative Neubauer won a special election in January of this year. She did not vote on the budget bill, but did vote on the other three weighted votes.
