

**NEBRASKA BROADCASTERS ASSOCIATION  
HALL OF FAME PROCEDURES (amended February, 2019)**

**BACKGROUND**

The NBA Hall of Fame was established in 1972. Charter members were individuals who had been recognized as “Broadcasters of the Year” prior to that time.

**CANDIDATES**

Candidates must have worked in Nebraska broadcasting and be recognized for their major contributions to broadcasting in Nebraska, other states, or on a national level. Candidates may also be Nebraska natives who are recognized for similar broadcasting contributions made elsewhere.

**NOMINATIONS**

Nominations are requested through website promotion, the NBA Newsletter (“The Modulator”), email reminders, and announcements during the annual convention.

Nominations can be made by any NBA member via the nomination form at [www.ne-ba.org/hof/](http://www.ne-ba.org/hof/) by the deadline posted each year. Nominations from non-members may be considered, with written approval from senior management of a member station where a prospective nominee was employed.

Nominations meeting our criteria with complete documentation are always considered to be active. For example, if five nominations are made in one year and two are selected for induction, the other three nominees remain on the list for future consideration.

Additional support for new and previous nominees is encouraged. Advocates may request in advance to appear at the NBA Board of Directors meeting at which selections will be made. For each nominee, one individual may make a presentation of up to five minutes, without the use of any audio or video technology. Individual will then be excused from any Board discussion of that nominee, exclusive of questions. Advocates may only be seated in a Board meeting for the duration of their presentation on their nominee.

**SELECTION**

Hall of Fame members are selected for induction if they are approved by a majority vote of the NBA Board of Directors present at a board meeting which has the required quorum.

Two candidates are usually approved each year. The Board can approve any number.
