See permit form.</p> <p>May 12th Update (Still needs written confirmation): In region travel will quarantine in Elim until COVID test results come in. They can be tested in Elim. Out of region travel still requires a 14 quarantine.</p>
Gambell	3/23/220	Y	N	City of Gambell at (907) 985-5112	<p>April 24th Update: Anyone who wishes to enter or leave Gambell must fill out a Valid Permission to Enter/Leave Form, provided that it is signed by the President of NVG, President of Sivuqaq Inc., and the City of Gambell. Upon returning to Gambell, the individuals must quarantine themselves for 14 days and not visit any public places.</p> <p>State and Local Law Enforcement are authorized to enforce individual compliance. Medical personnel from NSHC and ANMC are allowed to enter the city with proper identification and for medical reasons only. All personal travel is prohibited.</p>

Take temp with thermometer 2 x daily to monitor for fever.” Intervillage travel is prohibited. Please contact Morris Nassuk for requests about hunting and purchasing gas. They will not turn intervillage guests away if they are purchasing gas.</p>

			Y for any residents returning to Diomedes		quarantine in Nome for 14 days then quarantine another 14 days in Diomedes. Anyone traveling will also be requiring a Diomedes travel permit that must be approved by the mayor prior to traveling. People who are quarantined for 14 days in Diomedes cannot visit public work places or other residents' houses.

Unless emergent (i.e. medical, electrician, troopers, telephone, water and sewer) until May 1, 2020." They will be using the old clinic as a quarantine house. They are requiring a 14 day quarantine for anyone who arrives in St. Michael and all members in the house. Only one person in the house can run errands. May 12 th Update (Still needs written confirmation): Must receive a negative COVID test result in Nome prior to traveling. They must still quarantine for 14 days upon arrival in St. Michael.

Shaktoolik	3/23/2020	Y	N	City of Shaktoolik at (907) 955-3441 or IRA 955-3701	"Residents shall be informed to restrict traveling between communities and large cities..." All travelers must quarantine 14 days upon arrival as well as their family members in the household.
Savoonga	3/23/2020	Y	Y – Travelers from Anchorage or beyond must quarantine in Nome.	Myron Kingeekuk at (907) 984-2086	April 16 th Update: There will be no airline passengers allowed inside the community of Savoonga until May 31 st , 2020. Residents must quarantine in Nome for 14 days if traveling outside the region, then must quarantine for another 14 days upon their return to Savoonga while continuing to monitor for fever twice a day. Inter-village travel is not permitted except for emergency dental patients coming in from Gambell. Such patients need a written emergency approval from their health aide or PA. Dental patients must stay in the Savoonga quarantine housing for the duration of their stay. Exceptions to the travel ban include essential personnel for emergencies. May 12 th Update (Still needs written confirmation): Local agencies will reevaluate the ban on May 27 th , 2020. They plan to extend travel ban.

May 8 th Update: As of May 06, 2020 travel may be permitted upon approval by the City of Shishmaref for the following: individuals with family ties to the community, essential workers, medical appointments and/or emergencies and outside personnel for any community emergencies. Individuals will be mandated to quarantine for 2 weeks upon return to the community. It is recommended to take your temperature two

					<p>times a day and monitor for fever. All household members, that have a quarantined individual in their home, are required to wear a cloth face covering in public.</p> <p>Individuals that are leaving the community are required to complete a Travel Permit. This requirement is to review, plan, and agree to the 14 day quarantine guidelines upon return to Shishmaref.</p> <p>Travel restrictions have been extended until June 09, 2020.</p>
Stebbins	3/25/2020	Y	N	<p>City of Stebbins at (907) 934-3451 or the IRA 934-2393</p>	<p>April 27th Update: On April 25th, 2020 "all non-medical and inter-village air travel is prohibited from entering Stebbins for an additional 30 days." All returning residents will be mandated to self-isolate for 14 days upon return to the community, or until their COVID-19 test results have been confirmed with negative results.</p> <p>If any individuals leave St. Michael, they must not return to Stebbins until the additional 30 day travel restriction ends on May 25th, 2020 or until further notice.</p>
Teller	3/25/2020	Y	N	<p>City of Teller at (907) 642-3401 or Blanche Garnier (weekend #) 643-2295</p>	<p>Anyone entering the community/village of Teller via air or land must gain approval in writing from Acting Mayor, Blanche Garnie. If you have traveled out of the village, you must quarantine you and your household for 14 days at your place of residence. They must also take their temperature daily.</p> <p>May 12th Update (Still needs written confirmation): In region travel will require a 7 day quarantine upon return to Teller.</p>
Unalakleet	3/25/2020	Y	N YES for medical providers	<p>City of Unalakleet at (907) 310-1713</p>	<p>"There will be no airline passengers allowed within Unalakleet City Limits until May 1, 2020. Residents wishing to return home should do so immediately before the effective date and time with a mandatory two-week quarantine upon return. All household members of traveler must quarantine as well." Residents are not allowed back into the community while this ban is effective.</p> <p>Exceptions to the travel ban: "Essential medical travel and freight..." and "Patients who will need to travel in and out of UNK." If a person is traveling through Unalakleet, they do not need to call the City for permission to be there as long as they stay in designated the Airport.</p>

Quarantine 14 days after travel, including household members. Absolutely no loitering in public areas.</p>

White Mountain	3/23/2020	Y	N	City of White Mountain at (907) 638-3411	“Residents are urged to limit unnecessary travel; only essential travel will be accepted.” Residents will be mandated to self-isolate for two weeks upon return to the community and take their temperature every day. Nonresidents need approval.
Nome	3/26/2020	Y	Y	City Manager Glenn Steckman at (907) 433-6600 Or Clerk’s Office at 443-6663	All travelers who wish to leave or enter Nome via the airports must complete an Essential Air Travel Services Use Permit available at the City of Nome website (www.nomealaska.org). You must submit this permit to travelpermit@nomealaska.org , or you may fax it to the Clerk’s Office at (907) 443-5345. The quarantine plan (2 nd page) must also be filled out or it will be denied. Permit must be approved 72 hours before travel and it must be present at the airport. If you must leave and return, you need to isolate yourself for 14 days at home to reduce the risk of infecting your fellow community members. May 14th Update: Travel restrictions have been lifted for those coming into Nome from a village in the Bering Straits Region, unless the village states otherwise. Any travelers going from Nome to a regional village does not need a Nome Exit Permit. However, there are still travel restrictions for those traveling from Anchorage and beyond then into Nome.
