CONFESSION AND ASSURANCE

The leader invites the assembly into the confession.

The assembly kneels or sits and keeps silence for self-examination. The leader begins the confession.

P Holy and gracious God,

C **I confess that I have sinned against you this day. Some of my sin I know—the thoughts and words and deeds of which I am ashamed—but some is known only to you. In the name of Jesus Christ I ask forgiveness. Deliver and restore me, that I may rest in peace.**

P By the mercy of God we are united with Jesus Christ, in whom we are forgiven. We rest now in the peace of Christ and rise in the morning to serve.

The service includes a brief reading and is followed by extended silence for reflection or a brief meditation.

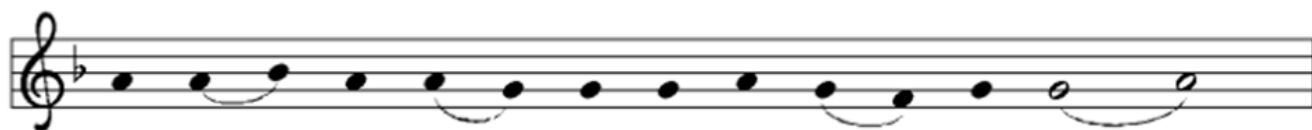



PRAYERS




P Hear my prayer, O Lord; C **listen to my cry.**




P Keep me as the apple of your eye;


THE LORD'S PRAYER (All)
