	ASPARAGUS	Harvesting a fair to light & decreasing volume of excellent quality product. Cool early season weather delayed the harvest but has drawn out the season.
	BABY SPINACH & ARUGULA	Harvesting very good quality products.
	BASIL	Likes warmer weather. Starting to harvest.
	BEETS	Harvesting a fair to good volume of good quality product.
	BLUEBERRIES	Minor quantities of early varieties like Weymouth starting late this week. The much more widely planted Duke variety will start early next week with volume available in two weeks.
	CABBAGE	Harvesting a light to increasing volume of very good quality products.
	CILANTRO	Harvesting a light to fair volume of good quality product.
	COLLARDS	Harvesting a fair to increasing volume of very good quality product.
	CUCUMBERS	Pickles harvesting in light to increasing volume, with cukes starting.
	DANDELIONS	Good quality bunched product harvesting in fair to good volume.
	DILL	Harvesting a fair to good volume of very good quality product.
	ESCAROLE & ENDIVE	Harvesting a fair to good volume of very good quality product.
	KALE	Good quality product harvesting in good volume.
	LEEKS	A good volume of good quality product is available.
	LETTUCE	Harvesting a light to fair volume of very good quality Boston, Red & Green Leaf, and Romaine due to rain delayed harvesting & low demand & prices. "Jersey Fresh" labeled romaine was not affected by the recent recall & should be marketed and purchased with confidence.

	MINT	Harvesting a good volume of good quality product.
	PARSLEY	Very good quality curly & plain product harvesting in fair to good volume.
	RADISHES	Harvesting good quality in fair to good volume.
	SPINACH	Harvesting a good volume of very good quality product.
	STRAWBERRIES	Finishing up the harvest of good quality berries in South Jersey as excessive rain slowed & hampered the harvesting, especially weekend PYO. Harvesting in more northern areas with matted row varieties available through late June. Mainly a direct marketed crop & not a large wholesale volume available.
	SQUASH	Harvesting light to increasing quantities of field grown zucchini with yellow squash starting.
	SWISS CHARD	Harvesting good quality product in good volume.
	TURNIPS	Harvesting very good quality products in fair to increasing volume.
