Mexican Tariff Update – The situation with Mexican imports and potential tariffs continues to be very fluid. Currently a 5% tariff is scheduled to commence on June 10th, affecting all products imported to the U.S. from Mexico, including fresh produce. This is in addition to the recent 17.56% tariff being imposed on Mexican tomatoes.

The true impact to cost and availability of those products is very much unknown. It is possible that at least a portion of these tariff impacts could be passed along to consumers at some point. As of now, markets haven't reacted significantly to the news, and government negotiations are ongoing.

Celery – Very light harvests out of Mexico and Central California continue to keep pricing high. Quality is fair, with abnormally leafy tops and seeder reported. The situation is expected to continue through the month of June. Avoid use where possible.

Avocados – Supplies continue to be light and expect to remain so into June. Pricing is higher than normal, and quality is fair.

Eggplant – Quality has been fair on the spring harvest out of Georgia and Florida, with light supplies and slightly higher pricing.

A Peek at Peak Seasons

Pineapples – Quality is excellent out of all Central American growing regions, with high sugar levels reported.

Stone Fruit – California Peaches, Nectarines, Apricots, and Plums are all available!

Kale – Quality is very nice, with full bunches and vibrant color reported.

Squash – Quality and pricing are great on Zucchini.

Potatoes – Smaller-sized Idaho baking potatoes are less expensive than larger ones. 80 CT and smaller are the best values.

Asparagus – Mexico and Peru are harvesting excellent quality in all sizes.

Watermelon – The Mexican and Southwestern U.S. harvest is yielding great quality with high sugar levels.

Specialty Melons – Canary, Casaba and Crenshaw melons are starting to be harvested.

Weather Update

California: Cooler temperatures early in the week, warming later with marine layer (foggy) conditions along the Central coast.

Mexico: Seasonably warm and dry conditions across most of the growing regions.

Southeastern U.S.: Very warm temperatures with widespread showers and thunderstorms.
