

Catholic Trivia 11-5 Answers:

1. Prior to Vatican II, the Sacrament of Extreme Unction was reserved for a person who had reached the point of death. Since Vatican II, the Catholic Church has recognized that when Jesus sent out His disciples to heal the sick, this command was not limited to the dying. To reflect this fact, the Catholic Church changed the name of the Sacrament of "Extreme Unction" to the "Anointing of the Sick." Now anyone who is suffering from serious illness is welcomed to receive this Sacrament in the hope of receiving the Lord's grace of spiritual and perhaps physical healing.
2. The Third Commandment is to keep holy the Sabbath, which for Catholics means to observe Sunday as a special day.
3. First, it must be grave matter (must be seriously wrong); secondly, the person must know that it is seriously wrong; third, the person must give full consent.
4. The sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist taken together form a person's initiation into the Catholic Church.
5. No. John the Baptist had been executed by order of Herod at an earlier time. Jesus knew of John's beheading (in prison; much earlier) and Matthew says that Jesus tried to withdraw alone to a deserted place on hearing this news, but the crowds followed Him (Matthew 14:13-15).
