

Catholic Trivia 1-23-26 Answers:

1. **Hypostatic union** (from the Greek: ὑπόστασις hypóstasis, “sediment, foundation, substance, subsistence”) is the theological term used in Christology to describe the union of Christ's humanity and divinity in one hypostasis, or individual existence.
2. The common term for our belief that in the one and only God there are three persons is **Trinity** (Holy Trinity, Blessed Trinity, Triune God...).
3. The heresy is called **Arianism**, named after its proponent, Arius, who stated that if the Son of God is begotten of God the Father, then the Father existed before the Son. And if Jesus is human, he can't also be divine.
4. The most common of the pope's many titles are Bishop of Rome, Vicar of Jesus Christ, Successor of the Prince of the Apostles, Supreme Pontiff of the Universal Church, Primate of Italy, Archbishop and Metropolitan of the Roman Province, Sovereign of the State of Vatican City, and Servant of the Servants of God.
5. Officially, Pope Leo XIV is the 267th pope and the **266th successor to the apostle Peter**,
