

Catholic Trivia 7-17 Answers:

1. **James (son of Zebedee) and James (son of Alphaeus).** Judas and Jude had similar names. Judas Iscariot, son of Simon, was the traitor. Jude, the saint, is also known as Thaddaeus. The other original Apostles were: Matthew, Peter (formerly Simon), Simon the Canaanite, Thomas, Bartholomew, Philip, John and Andrew (brother of Peter).
2. **Tax collector.** Prior to preaching the word of God, he worked as a tax collector in Capernaum.
3. **Orthodox.** Contemporary Orthodox catechisms and textbooks all affirm that the church recognizes seven *mystēria* (“sacraments”): baptism, chrismation, Communion, holy orders, penance, anointing of the sick, and marriage.
4. **November** is traditionally the month in which the Church remembers her dead, and in a special way we are invited to remember our family and friends who have died, especially those who have passed in the previous year.
5. **Pope Pius XI.** His personal fondness of technology and academics spurred his development of Vatican Radio in 1931, and he became the first Pope to be broadcast by radio. He also founded the Pontifical Academy for the Sciences in 1936.
