

Catholic Trivia 1-16-26 Answers:

1. Jesus was probably around 30 years old when he began his public ministry, although there are no records that explicitly mention this.
2. The public ministry of Jesus lasted about 3 years.
3. Jesus called 12 apostles.
4. According to Matthew 10:2–4: “These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Him.” The Gospel of John uses the name “Nathanael” instead of “Bartholomew,” but Nathanael and Bartholomew were undoubtedly the same person.
5. Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus, was replaced in the twelve apostles by Matthias (see Acts 1:20–26).
