

Catholic Trivia 1-14 Answers:

1. **Sacraments of Initiation** (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist); **Sacraments of Healing** (Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick); **Sacraments at the Service of Communion** (Matrimony and Holy Orders)
2. The “age of reason” is the time of life at which a person is assumed to be morally responsible and able to distinguish between right and wrong. It is generally held to be by the end of the seventh year, although it may be earlier. It also may be later for some people.
3. A thurible is **a metal censer in which incense is burned during religious services**. The thurible is suspended from chains and is gently swung by the priest or thurifer in order to spread the fragrant smoke of the incense.

5. When a pope issues a document *motu proprio*, it means he does so **by his own motivation**. As Catholic News Service puts in its style guide, “Popes use it to signal a special personal interest in the subject.” The phrase *motu proprio* does not refer to a document itself, but rather the manner in which a document is released. That is, a document is released *motu proprio* when the pope wants to change or enact an existing church rule—or when he has something to say that is not in reply to a request or a petition but instead comes from his own interest in a particular matter. Popes have used this form of document since the 15th century.
