Aunt Cassie said she always felt secure when she was in her car. I guess now we know why!



SWAMP GRITS

GRITS:

1/2 - 3/4 cup grits (according to preferred consistency and package directions)

2 cups water

1 1/2 cup of half and half

1/4 lb. mild or sharp cheddar cheese cut into small cubes

1/2 cup heavy cream

1/2 teaspoon Old Bay seasoning

salt and pepper to taste

In medium/large pot bring water and half & half to boil. Stir in grits. Bring to a boil, then simmer. Cook until grits are done. Stir often to prevent sticking. Add cheese, cream and seasoning. Keep warm.

NOTE: Bro. Ron measures his grits differently. 1 heaping tablespoon per serving. Then cover with liquid (water and half & half). Add water if grits become too thick when cooking. You do not want the grits to be too thin, as you will be adding the below "Topping" ingredients.

TOPPING:

1/4 cup olive oil

1 lb. peeled/deveined shrimp (any size you prefer)

1/4 lb. country sausage or andouille thinly sliced

1/4 lb. red peppers cut into thin strips

3/4 cup Marsala Cooking Wine

1/2 stick butter

1 teaspoon Old Bay seasoning

1/2 cup tomato juice

In large skillet, heat olive oil to medium heat. Add shrimp, peppers, sausage, wine, butter and seasoning. Cook until shrimp and sausage are done. Add tomato juice and get it hot.

Pour over grits and serve.

Good with toast, cornbread or hushpuppies.
