Garbage City - Egypt

Tons of garbage, everywhere.

Anyone who walks through the narrow streets of Garbage City must quickly learn how to compete for space with cars, pedestrians, tricycles and trucks. Piles of garbage bags hide not only the modest entrances of hundreds of buildings, but also the sorrows and the dreams of more than 200,000 people who live there.

Our first stop is at a clinic that cares for patients with special needs. The question people ask here is the same one heard by Jesus almost two thousand years ago: "... Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" (John 9: 2).

Moved by shame and feeling punished by God, the Garbage City families did not use to even mention that they had children with special needs. Today, after 24 years of work, the Center of Love clinic has helped to change this perspective, proclaiming the same response Jesus gave: "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him." (John 9: 3). Visually impaired, deaf and people with cerebral palsy are attended daily by a team of teachers, physiotherapists, speech therapists and volunteers - 200 patients in total.

If you have the opportunity to walk through the Garbage City do not spend too much time looking at the trash, but look for the traces of Jesus, who continues walking and revealing himself to the poor and marginalized, expressing the immeasurable love of God for the people who live there. Jesus continues walking and transforming lives in the Garbage City - "Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me, and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me." (Matthew 10:40)

Do something! Here are some opportunities for you to take part in what God is doing in the Garbage City:

- Volunteer: physiotherapists, speech therapists, educators

- Support families in need: Our staff in Egypt visit families, distribute food packages, pray and share the Gospel with extremely needy families in the Garbage City. Through the Hope for MENA website you can give financially to these families: www.hopeformena.org



Leaving Garbage City we went to another area near the city of Cairo, a neighborhood formed predominantly by refugees from North Sudan from an ethnic group called Nuba. There are thousands of Nuba refugees who have come to Egypt fleeing the genocide they are facing in Sudan. Without work permit, access to education and under discrimination, this people struggle to survive. Faced with this reality, our team in Egypt started a school called the Center of Hope for Sudanese refugee children. Today 50 kids are attending this school, having the opportunity to learn about the Bible and to share with their families about the hope that there is in Jesus. A church was formed as a result of this work and the place where the children gather during the week also serves as a church on Sundays. The challenge now is to find a bigger place where more children can enroll, and where more people can come together to worship God!

* In March I (Julio) went with team from Maryland to visit some projects that OM is carrying out in Egypt. The goal was to identify opportunities for this church to partner with a local project. Of the projects we visited, they chose to support the work among the Sudanese refugees. Pray that more people and churches will decide to be part of what God is doing in Egypt and for more Egyptians to come to faith in Christ!
