SWAMP PONDERINGS

"A Mother's Sage Sayings and Advice"

Back when I was in elementary school, the principal, Mr. Tillery, and I became good friends. Well, we saw each other often enough to be good friends! I could always count on Mr. Tillery to offer sound advice meant to help keep me out of trouble.

Mr. Tillery always had an awesome respect for parents, especially mothers - and especially his mother. He said his mother taught all kinds of good and important things. He often commended his mother for always knowing just the right words to say to challenge and encourage him.

He said one time his mother came in to wake him, saying, "OK. Get up! It's time for school."

"Alright. Give me two good reasons why you don't want to go to school."

His words come to me now, and make me think of the sage sayings and advice my mother has given me over the years.

Things on subjects like:

Logic: "Because I said so, that's why!"

Sound Brotherly Advice: "If you are going to kill each other, do it outside. I've just finished cleaning in here."

Foresight: "Make sure you have on clean underwear, in case you are in an accident."

Religion: "You better pray that stain will come out of your shirt."

Irony: "Keep crying and I'll give you something to cry about!"

Oppressive Osmosis: "Shut your mouth and eat your supper!"

Self Contortionism: "Will you just look at the dirt on the back of your neck."

Fortitude: "You are going to sit there until all that liver is finished."

Hypocrisy: "If I've told you once, I've told you a million times - Don't Exaggerate!"

Envy: "There are millions of less fortunate children in this world who don't have wonderful parents like you do."



BLUEBERRY-ALMOND TART

1 1/2 cup butter

2 teaspoons baking powder

8 large eggs

1 teaspoon salt

3 cups Splenda or sugar

1 tablespoon vanilla extract

2 teaspoons almond extract

1 1/2 cups blueberries

2 1/2 cups all purpose flour

1/3 cup almond slivers

Preheat oven to 325°

Grease and lightly flour a 12 inch pan. Melt butter in bowl and let cool. Beat eggs at medium speed (30 seconds or so). Gradually add sugar. Beat until light/fluffy. Add almond and vanilla extracts. Gradually add flour, almonds, baking powder and salt. Beat in well. Add butter. Beat in well. Spread batter on prepared pan surface. Toss blueberries in 1 tablespoon flour, then sprinkle them onto batter surface. Slightly press blueberries even with surface.

Bake 42-45 minutes. Check with toothpick.

Cool 25-30 minutes.

Dust with powdered sugar and/or serve with whipped cream.
