## Required Book Assignment- Dialectical Journal (due to English teacher the first Friday of school)

- 1. Complete ONE dialectical journal entry per chapter for your required book (see sample below).
- 2. Your entry should include the <u>entire quote from the passage</u> about which you are writing your entry, the <u>page number</u> where you found it, and <u>a 3-5 sentence entry</u> that accomplishes one or two of the following tasks:
  - Make a connection to your life, the world, or another text (C)
  - Make a prediction about what might happen next in the text or in a particular character's development (P)
  - Make clarifying comments about some confusion you had while reading earlier portions of the text or affirm/disaffirm earlier predictions (CL)

- Reflect upon what the passage means in a broad sense (not just about the characters in the story). What conclusions can you draw about human nature or the ways of the world based upon this text? (R)
- Evaluate: make a judgment about the characters, their actions, or what the author is trying to say (E)
