Vestry terms run for three years, and the hope is that we will find parishioners that are insightful, passionate, critical thinkers that are willing to put in the work needed to maintain and grow our church, St. Philip's.

Vestry membership is not a hard job and can be very fulfilling, but it does require a lot of effort sometimes, and it is not just sitting through a meeting on the third Tuesday of each month. Each year we have strategic initiatives and goals that determine the direction of the church, and we maintain relationships with the six ministry boards that help make the church what it is as well as minister to the congregation.

As mentioned earlier, we are looking for candidates that are willing to do the work needed. If you feel a calling to join us and run for election, we would really like to hear from you. There are some qualifications that you should know, and they are:

Adult Member – A person who has received the Sacrament of Holy Baptism with water in the name of the Holy Trinity, whether in this Church, or in another Christian Church, and who's Baptism has been duly recorded in this Church. A member sixteen years of age or older.

Adult Communicant in good standing – A member who is at least 16 years of age and has received Holy Communion at least three times during the preceding year. A member who for the previous year has been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for spread of the Kingdom of God.
