

Finance and Facilities Board

Treasurer- Bob Fuchs: End-of-year financial activities are completed. Normal monthly activities are underway. January results will be published in early February. As a result of the generosity of St. Philips parishioners, the significant delay in the completion of the new parish hall and underspending in several budget areas we were able to prepay 2022 expenses for several line items, increase funding for Maintenance Reserves and insurance deductibles and still finish the year with a small surplus over the 2021 budget.

New Parish Hall- Chair- Bill Bittenbender: We can't seem to 'cut a break". Sub-contractor delays continue to plague our project and we have had to slip our completion date until mid-April. On the positive side electrical power was shutdown and transferred to the new building from the Sanctuary, a major milestone. Framing inspection was completed with nothing but a few comments, they will be back this week to clear any open items as well as start construction on the Robing area on the 2nd floor, this is being converted from the storage room that has been in place since the original construction of the Sanctuary. Insulation sub- contractor has been on site and is ordering insulation for the new building, to start next week. Siding installation is ongoing and painting will commence again when the weather breaks. Of "great" importance, sewer connection was installed and passed inspection, yea!

Buildings and Grounds- Chair- Bryan Wester: Thank you to Steve Russell for helping trim limbs behind the Main Church. These had grown up and were pushing against the windows behind the altar. Thank you to Bill Tomz and David Forsyth for assisting with a "Ground Fault" problem we had with our Fire Alarm System. This condition did not prevent any fire monitoring but was a trouble condition that has now been repaired.
