What is Academic WorldQuest?

The **Carlos and Malu Alvarez Academic WorldQuest National Competition** is a flagship youth education program of the national network of World Affairs Councils. This team competition tests high school students' knowledge of international affairs. Four-person teams compete by answering multiple-choice questions divided into ten unique and engaging thematic categories. Across the country 5,000 students participate in competitions hosted by 50 local World Affairs Councils. Winning teams are invited to represent their high school and local competition, held in the spring in the nation's capital, Washington, DC.
