BE ALL YOU CAN BE!

Before Moshe starts the song that makes up most of the Parsha, he wants everyone to know that even though Hashem is going to punish the Jews in the future for their sins, Hashem is not "cruel." Hashem's got all the power in the world, but He never uses that power to punish a *Rasha* more than it takes to get *Teshuva* out of him. Moshe reminds *Bnai Yisrael* that he, himself, will never enter *Eretz Yisrael* as a punishment for hitting the rock. Sometimes it seems like too great a punishment but that's because our minds aren't able to comprehend Hashem's judgment system. It is important to accept punishment in the right spirit – even if you're upset about it. Try being mature, and ask yourself why you're smack in the middle of a round of bad luck:

- Are your *Midot* all they can be?
- Are you *Davening* properly?
- Are you being kind to your friends?
- Are you listening to your parents the way you should?

The right answer can sometimes end a drought, so think hard. You don't have to join the army to be all you can be!

DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know that the Beta Israel- the Ethiopian Jews- celebrated Sukkot a bit differently than us in Ethiopia? While they observe Sukkot as a day like Shabbat, and did (try to) collect the Arbeh Minim (four species) and observed Shemini Atzeret as a time to pray for rain, the one big part of Sukkot they did not observe is...the building of Sukkahs?! It's true. So why didn't they build sukkahs? Well the answer is pretty simple. Most people lived in houses that were already, essentially sukkahs, so there was no need (or even perhaps, a point) to build sukkahs for the holiday. Today, in Israel many Beta Israel now build Sukkahs- a reminder to both our days wondering in the dessert and to their days back in Ethiopia living in sukka-like homes.
