THE BIRDS AND THE BEASTS

Three types of unblemished, kosher domestic animals may be used for *Korbanot* in the *Mishkan*. Each one reminds us of the greatness of the *Avot* (forefathers):

1. OX - Avraham ran to get an ox to serve his guests.
2. SHEEP - Yitzchak is compared to a lamb when he was brought as a sacrifice, and a ram (a male sheep) was ultimately sacrificed instead of him
3. GOAT - Yaakov was instructed by Rivka to take two kid goats from the flock and bring them to his father.



Only two kinds of birds can be offered:

1. Turtle Doves and Doves (pigeons).

DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know that a little over two years ago archaeologists in East Jerusalem found a piece of clay from the 8th Century BCE bearing the seal of King David's descendant King Chizkiyahu? What's the big deal you might ask? Well, a lot of people doubt that anything written in the books of Torah is true- and question whether a "character" like Chizkiyahu even existed. This seal gives actual historical proof that there indeed was a (great) Jewish king named Chizkiyahu. There are a few other items in the world that bear this seal, HOWEVER, this is the first discovered by archaeologists & its authenticity cannot be questioned. In fact there is now archaeological evidence of 54 people mentioned in Tanach having been real people.
