Many of us, as little girls, dreamed of becoming a dancer, twirling in front of the television as Ginger Rogers and Gene Kelly spun around the screen. Today, we enjoy *Dancing With the Stars*. Little did we know, we have a dancer extraordinaire living among us in Frisco Lakes. Meet Lois Springer!

At age 80, she has an unbounding energy and lust for life. Lois has been dancing for 17 years but didn't pick it up until she retired from Government service. Lois was an intelligence research analyst, first with the National Security Agency (NSA), then with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

Early Career

Soon after Lois graduated from Penn State in 1964, she was hired by the NSA's Cuba Section; they were still monitoring Cuba following the 1962 Missile Crisis. During her time with the NSA, she completed her master's degree at the University of Maryland with an NSA scholarship. She went from NSA Fort Meade to the DEA El Paso Intelligence Center (EPIC), and on to DEA Phoenix. On September 10, 2001, Lois was transferred from Phoenix to DEA Headquarters across from the Pentagon. On the infamous 9/11, she had to evacuate the building but, thankfully, she was living in temporary quarters and could walk to her apartment.

Lois's husband, James, passed away 13 years ago. He was retired from the NSA and ordained as a permanent deacon in the Catholic church. Lois and James had a wonderful 48 1/2 year marriage and had four daughters: Lisa, a lawyer now living in Australia; Gabrielle, who lives in Flower Mound; Kara, who lives in California; and Andrea, who lives in Canada.

Why Dancing?

While living in Scottsdale, Arizona, Lois's daughters gave her an introductory offer for dance lessons with Genadi, a Bulgarian instructor. She took lessons with Genadi for 10 years.

Since Lois has wet macular degeneration, her daughters wanted her to move closer to one of them. Lois reasoned, "Australia was too far, Canada was too cold, and California was too expensive. So, Gabrielle in Flower Mound was the logical choice." Lois also has a sister living in Plano. With her reasoning, Lois moved to Dallas in 2015. For four years (until COVID hit), Lois continued her dance lessons with Sergei, a Russian instructor, at Studio 22. Even after Lois moved to Frisco Lakes in 2017, she made the trip to Fort Worth twice a week, danced for 1 1/2 hours, then drove home. In 2023, she resumed lessons with Balin', a Hungarian instructor in Fort Worth.

The Big Payoff

In June 2023, Balin' organized a 2-week trip for three of his students and his family, first to his home in Hungary, then on to Croatia for a ballroom dancing competition. The group received a warm welcome from Balin's mother and stepfather in his hometown of Pecs. The following day, Balin's stepfather drove the group in a van to Croatia. They arrived late one night, four days before the competition. Lois said her hotel room was gorgeous, including a chandelier and a window overlooking the Adriatic Sea.

The Competition

Twenty-five countries participated in the competition, but the only other competitor in Lois's age group was from England. Two days before the competition, three ladies from Ukraine made a 24-hour bus trip to Croatia to do the dancers' hair and makeup. They did a great job! Everyone marveled at their courage to make the trip from their war-torn country to Croatia.

The Trip Home

The day after the competition, everyone left except Lois; she decided to take a day to rest. The next day, she took a shuttle to Zagreb, the capital of Croatia, only to discover her flight was canceled. She was stranded! However, the airport staff arranged an Air France flight to Paris, a change of planes there, then an Air France flight to Newark, NJ. Guess what — her luggage never made it out of Paris! Lois spent the night in Newark, then boarded a United Airlines flight to Wilkes Barre, PA, then rode an Uber to her hometown of Hazelton to attend her 63rd high school reunion.

The Reunion

All she had was a bag carrying her shoes and makeup so off to Boscov's she went to buy some clothes for the 2-day reunion — "Meet and Greet" then dinner at the Country Club. Forty-five people attended the reunion and they all had a great time.

Lois wants everyone to know that at any age, we need to get out there, and *live!*

BEAUTY and the BEAST

Many plants and animals can be one or the other of these, the "beauty" that we love to see in our community or the "beast" that is destructive to that same community. One of these for North Texas is the Cattle Egret. As you can see in the pictures, this bird, one of the four egret species found in Texas, can be very attractive. They can often be seen flying over Frisco Lakes in various formations, some loosely organized, on their way to and from their feeding areas. Both in the air and on the ground, it can be a good sight to see.

Cattle Egrets also play an important role in insect control when they are present. Unlike other egret species, which are attracted to and found

near water, Cattle Egrets are typically found in grassy fields where they can feed on insects. Often, they are seen near herds of cattle feeding in fields. Cattle Egrets feed on insects in the field near cattle and even insects which are on the cattle themselves.

When these birds are in an appropriate rural environment, they can be fully appreciated. Unfortunately, they have had a downside for some communities in the North Texas area. Cattle Egrets are not native to Texas. They were first seen in Texas in 1954 and have spread throughout the state since that time. When they establish their breeding area, it is known as a rookery. Rookeries may have hundreds or even thousands of egrets; in an urban area they can create a noisy area with bad odors and potential health dangers from various decaying organic matter including eggshells, dead birds, and insect remains. Some of the urban areas in north Texas affected by rookeries include Arlington, Carrollton, and Bedford. The problem was serious enough for some communities to put out guides on how to prevent establishment of nesting areas.

Prevention or establishment is really the only option that communities have for this potential problem because egrets, along with herons, are protected by both Federal and State law and by International Treaties. Once the birds are nesting and have started laying eggs, they cannot legally be harassed or injured by efforts to remove them. While other herons or egrets are often nesting in the same area as Cattle Egrets, it is the Cattle Egret that, by mid-summer, usually makes up the majority of those rookeries according to expert reports.



As of 2023, Frisco Lakes is probably not in great danger of becoming a rookery for Cattle Egrets, but we have a number of conditions that may make us more likely to be a potential target in future years. One factor is that in most cases the Cattle Egrets join rookeries first established by other egrets or herons who are seeking to be near water. Since we are near Lake Lewisville and have a number of water features in our community, we might be attractive to those birds seeking to nest near water. We also have a large natural area along the stretch of land that runs from FM 423 north of Del Webb Blvd., under the Del Webb bridge, and then widening out to the city-owned area with

constructed retention ponds between Neighborhoods 25 and 26, continuing into the Corps of Engineer controlled area south of Neighborhood 15. The area south of the Del Webb bridge is known as the Hackberry Creek Wetlands. In addition, we have ponds on the portion of Frisco Lakes north of Stonebrook, which link toward the natural area east of Frisco Lakes and run between portions of the development to the East and then West into additional wetland areas toward Lake Lewisville.

The one thing that makes this less of an immediate danger for Frisco Lakes is the fact that our community is still fairly new and does not have a large number of mature trees. Once trees get large

enough to provide a thick canopy in an area near water, they provide a more attractive area for a rookery. The City of Arlington, in their online publication about Cattle Egret rookery prevention, suggests that it is very important to keep trees trimmed in a way that makes the interior open to sunlight, and prevent trees from overlapping where birds could walk



from one tree to another. They suggest getting an arborist's help on this (use the QR code to see this publication). Keeping your trees properly pruned may also help your lawn, too, as a side benefit.

Enjoy the beauty of the birds flying overhead in their V formations and of seeing them on the edge of water here in Frisco Lakes or perched in trees. However, be alert for any signs that herons or egrets are gathering in numbers because the "beast" can also be lurking.

Insights from Dr. Oteo

Sometimes the best spine therapy starts with the hip.

There is considerable overlap in the symptoms of back and hip issues; and sometimes patients can have both. It is therefore important for doctors to remove their

"blinders" and think outside the bounds of their subspecialties. The low back cannot be assessed without considering the hips and visa versa. All too many patients have come to my clinic having already undergone a hip replacement for what turned out to be a spine issue or a back surgery for what was a bad hip all along. The key to avoiding this unfortunate occurrence is to really listen to patients' symptoms, perform thorough physical examinations, and scrutinize imaging studies. If questions remain regarding the source of the symptoms, specialized testing or targeted diagnostic treatment isolating one specific area or the other can provide additional helpful information.

Unsure about where to start? Some clues that an issue might be hip related is pain in the groin or pain when lifting the leg up to get out of the car. Pain radiating below the knee or associated with numbness or tingling is more likely coming from a pinched nerve in the spine. I recommend to find a specialist who listens and takes the time to examine you through a broad scope.

In patients whose pain is determined to be coming from a combination of back and hip problems, I generally advocate for first addressing whichever is more painful or functionally limiting. Interestingly, fixing one problem often leads to improvement in the other as patients are no longer forced to compensate. RECIPE OF THE MONTH Ukrainian Borscht

Submitted by Marina Malinskaya, N18

Instructions:

- 1. Prepare meat broth (optional): boil 1 lb. meat with bones (beef, pork, or chicken) in 0.5 - 0.75 gallon pot of water.
- 2. After 2-3 minutes of boiling, drain the water, rinse meat, pour new water.
- When boiling, add salt and cook meat 1.5 hours (chicken) or 2 hours (beef and pork).
- 4. Remove meat from pot.
- Prepare vegetables: wash cabbage (0.5 lbs.), small onion, beet, carrot. Remove skin from onion, beet, carrot, and wash again.
- Cut cabbage and onion into small pieces then add to boiling broth. Reduce heat to low. Cook for 15 minutes.
- Grate beet and carrot in coarse grater. Add to pot. Cook another 15 minutes.
- 8. Cut cooked meat into small pieces. Add to pot.

To complete cooking, there are two options:

1. Add 0.5 teaspoon of lemon juice (squeeze out fresh lemon or use dry lemon acid) and 2 tablespoons of sugar to pot. Add more if you wish. The taste must be sweet and sour.

2. Add 2 tablespoons of tomato paste and 2 tablespoons of sugar to pot (classic recipe).

Optional: add chopped dill or parsley.

The Borscht can be cooked without broth.

Let the Borscht rest at least 2 hours for the vegetables to "meet" each

Serve with sour cream, peeled clove of garlic, and rye bread.
