Yes, Boy Scouts can earn the Golf merit badge. It is one of 135 merit badges currently available to scouts today. They cover a wide range of subjects including sports, crafts, science, trades, business and future careers. Some have been a part of Scouting since the beginning in 1910...First Aid, Cycling, Horsemanship, Pioneering...to name a few. But Scouting has grown over time to now include Animation, Composite Materials, Entrepreneurship and Geocaching among the most recent additions to the merit badge offerings.

But it is not just about the 1" patch a scout receives upon completion of a badges requirements. They will have set a goal, been mentored by an adult volunteer merit badge counselor and gained knowledge and hands on experiences on the subject matter of that badge. And studies have shown that for every 100 Boy Scouts eight will enter a vocation they were introduced to through the merit badge program.
