



ESPLOST Background



Randolph County school district has 990 students enrolled in one elementary, one middle school, and one high school.



Burke County has Plant Vogtle which generates approximately \$31 million in revenue for schools each year.

Can Provide Funding for Capital Needs

- Additions & Renovations
- Acquiring Land & Property
- Buses & Vehicles
- Equipment
- Textbooks & Learning Resources
- Pay down current or previous debt



Cannot Provide Funding for Annual Operations

- Employee salaries & benefits
- District operations & maintenance



Sales Tax Funding of Capital Needs




Reduces need for long term debt

Paid for within 1 - 5 years




Traditional Funding of Capital Needs




How is Education Funded and Where does the Money Go, Annually?

Dalton Public Schools
\$73,990,000 Revenues



ESPLOST Funds City & County Schools

ESPLOST is a joint effort between the Whitfield County and Dalton boards of education.

- Asking to collect up to \$98 million countywide over five years
- Taxes divided based on student enrollment in each district
 - 37.7% of revenue to city schools (up to \$36.9 million)
 - 62.3% of revenue to county schools (up to \$61.1 million)
