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## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to improve grants, payments, and technical assistance provided by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to serve homeless veterans, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.**

2 (a) **SHORT TITLE.**—This Act may be cited as the  
3 **“Building Solutions for Veterans Experiencing Homeless-  
4 ness Act of 2021”.**

5 (b) **TABLE OF CONTENTS.**—The table of contents for

7 **SEC. 2. ADJUSTMENTS OF GRANTS AWARDED BY THE SEC-  
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RETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS FOR COM-  
PREHENSIVE SERVICE PROGRAMS TO SERVE  
HOMELESS VETERANS.

(a) **ELIMINATION OF MATCHING REQUIREMENT.**

(1) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 2011(e) of title 38, United States Code, is amended—  
(A) by striking paragraph (2); and  
(B) by redesignating paragraph (3) as paragraph (2).

11 (A) by striking "Subsektion (e)(2)" and in-  
12 serting the following:

15 (B) by adding at the end the following new  
16 subparagraph:

21 (b) ELIMINATION OF PROPERTY DISPOSITION RE-  
22 QUIREMENTS.—

1        of this Act for a project described in subsection  
2        (b)(1) of such section shall not be subject to any  
3        property disposition requirements relating to the  
4        grant under subsection (e) or (f) of section 61.67 of  
5        title 38, Code of Federal Regulations, section  
6        200.311(e) of title 2, Code of Federal Regulations,  
7        or successor regulations.

8                (2) SUNSET.—Section 4201(b)(6) of the John-  
9        ny Isakson and David P. Roe, M.D. Veterans Health  
10      Care and Benefits Improvement Act of 2020 (Public  
11      Law 116-315; 134 Stat. 5010; 38 U.S.C. 2011  
12      note) is amended—

13                (A) by striking “During” and inserting the  
14      following:

15                “(A) IN GENERAL.—During”, and  
16                (B) by adding at the end the following new  
17      subparagraph:

18                “(B) SUNSET.—Subparagraph (A) shall  
19      cease to be effective on the date of the enact-  
20      ment of the Building Solutions for Veterans  
21      Experiencing Homelessness Act of 2021.”.

1 SEC. 3. INCREASE IN MAXIMUM RATES OF PER DIEM PAY-  
2 MENTS PROVIDED BY THE SECRETARY OF

6 Code, is amended—

8                   and inserting “200”; and

11 **SEC. 4. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY SECRETARY**  
12 **OF VETERANS AFFAIRS TO CERTAIN GRANT**  
13 **RECIPIENTS.**

14 (a) SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VERY LOW INCOME  
15 FAMILIES IN PERMANENT HOUSING.—Section 2044(e) of  
16 title 38, United States Code, is amended by striking para-  
17 graph (2) and inserting the following new paragraph (2):  
18 “(2) Not less than two percent of the amounts avail-  
19 able under paragraph (1) in any fiscal year may be avail-  
20 able to provide technical assistance under subsection (d).”.

(b) COMPREHENSIVE SERVICE PROGRAMS.—Section 2011 of title 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new subsection:

24        "(i) TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—(1)  
25 The Secretary shall provide training and technical assist-  
26 ance to each recipient of a grant under this section regard-

1 ing the planning, development, and provision of services  
2 for which the grant is made.

3       “(2) The Secretary may provide the training and  
4 technical assistance described in paragraph (1) directly or  
5 through grants or contracts with such public or nonprofit  
6 private entities as the Secretary considers appropriate.

7       “(3) Not less than two percent of amounts designated  
8 for the administration of grants under this section in any  
9 fiscal year shall be used to provide training and technical  
10 assistance under this subsection.”.

11 SEC. 5. REPORT AND ACTION ON SHALLOW SUBSIDY PRO-  
12 GRAM UNDER THE SUPPORTIVE SERVICES  
13 FOR VETERAN FAMILIES PROGRAM.

14 (a) REPORT REQUIRED.—

## 8 (i) race and ethnicity;

9 (ii) gender;

10 (iii) geographic location; and

11 (iv) age.

12 (B) A description of support provided to  
13 special populations under the program, includ-  
14 ing elderly veterans, women veterans, children  
15 of veterans, disabled veterans, veterans  
16 transitioning from certain institutions, and mi-  
17 nority veterans.

18 (C) A description of the decision-making  
19 process of the Department of Veterans Affairs  
20 regarding which locations would be eligible for  
21 coverage under the program.

(D) An assessment of whether increasing the payment rate under the program is necessary.

(E) An assessment of whether it is feasible and beneficial to expand the program nationally.

4 (F) An assessment of the efficacy of the  
5 increased payments provided under the program  
6 based on increases in number of veterans served  
7 and number of veterans transitioned into per-  
8 manent housing.

9           (b) INCREASE IN PAYMENT RATE.—If the assess-  
10 ment described in subsection (a)(2)(D) finds that increas-  
11 ing the payment rate under the program is necessary, the  
12 Secretary shall issue such regulations as may be necessary  
13 to increase such rate.

14 (e) EXPANSION OF PROGRAM.—If the assessment de-  
15 scribed in subsection (a)(2)(E) finds that it is feasible and  
16 beneficial to expand the program nationally, the Secretary  
17 shall so expand the program not later than two years after  
18 the date on which the report required by subsection (a)(1) is  
19 submitted.

## 20 SEC. 6. HOUSING AND HEALTH CARE NAVIGATORS GRANT

## PROGRAM.

22 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter H of chapter 20 of  
23 title 38, United States Code, is amended—

24 (1) by redesignating section 2014 as section  
25 2015; and

1 (2) by inserting after section 2013 the following  
2 new section 2014:

5       “(a) PROGRAM REQUIRED.—The Secretary shall es-  
6 tablish and carry out a program under which the Sec-  
7 retary shall provide services to assist veterans with navi-  
8 gating housing and health care resources in order to im-  
9 prove the retention of housing by and overall health of—

10           “(1) veterans who were previously homeless and  
11           are transitioning to permanent housing; and

12               “(2) veterans who are at risk of becoming  
13 homeless.

14        "(b) GRANTS.—(1) The Secretary shall carry out the  
15 program established under subsection (a) through the  
16 award of grants.

17       “(2) In awarding grants under paragraph (1), the  
18 Secretary shall give priority to organizations that dem-  
19 onstrate the capability to provide services described in  
20 subsection (a), particularly organizations that are success-  
21 fully providing or have successfully provided transitional  
22 housing services using amounts provided by the Secretary  
23 under sections 2012 and 2061 of this title.

24        (e) STAFFING. In areas where individuals who  
25 meet the licensure and certification requirements to pro-

1 vide services described in subsection (a) are in high de-  
2 mand as determined by the Secretary, a grantee under the  
3 program may provide such services through one or more  
4 individuals with a master's degree in social work who are  
5 undergoing training to meet such requirements, if such in-  
6 dividuals are under the supervision of an individual who  
7 meets such requirements.

8       “(d) SERVICES.—Services provided under this section  
9 shall include services to assist veterans with navigating re-  
10 sources provided by the Federal Government and State,  
11 local, and Tribal governments.

12       “(e) REPORT ON SERVICES PROVIDED.—The Sec-  
13 retary shall require each recipient of a grant awarded  
14 under subsection (b)(1) to submit to the Secretary a re-  
15 port that describes the services provided or coordinated  
16 with amounts under such grant.”.

17       (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 20013(a)  
18 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act  
19 (38 U.S.C. 2011 note) is amended by striking “2014” and  
20 inserting “2015”.

21       (e) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections  
22 at the beginning of chapter 20 of such title is amended  
23 by striking the item relating to section 2014 and inserting  
24 the following new items:

“2014. Housing and health care navigators grant program.

“2015. Authorization of appropriations.”.

1   **SEC. 7. GRANT PROGRAM FOR SUBSTANCE USE AND ALCO-**  
2                   **HOL USE DISORDER RECOVERY FOR HOME-**  
3                   **LESS VETERANS.**

4       (a) **PILOT PROGRAM REQUIRED.**—Not later than 180  
5    days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-  
6    retary of Veterans Affairs shall commence carrying out a  
7    pilot program under which the Secretary shall award  
8    grants to eligible entities for the provision or coordination  
9    of services for recovery from substance use disorder or al-  
10   cohol use disorder for veterans who were previously home-  
11   less and are transitioning to permanent housing and vet-  
12   erans who are at risk of becoming homeless.

13       (b) **DURATION.**—The Secretary shall carry out the  
14    pilot program during the five-year period beginning on the  
15    date of the commencement of the pilot program.

16       (c) **AWARD OF GRANTS.**—

17           (1) **IN GENERAL.**—In carrying out the pilot  
18    program, the Secretary shall award a grant to an el-  
19    igible entity for each veteran with substance use dis-  
20    order or alcohol use disorder participating in the  
21    pilot program for which the eligible entity is pro-  
22    viding or coordinating the provision of recovery serv-  
23    ices for substance use disorder or alcohol use dis-  
24    order, as the case may be, under the pilot program.

25           (2) **INTERVALS OF PAYMENT AND MAXIMUM**  
26    **AMOUNTS.**—The Secretary may establish intervals of

1 payment for the administration of grants under this  
2 section and a maximum amount to be awarded, in  
3 accordance with the services being provided and the  
4 duration of such services.

5 (3) PREFERENCE.—In awarding grants under  
6 paragraph (1), the Secretary shall give preference to  
7 eligible entities providing or coordinating the provi-  
8 sion of recovery services for substance use disorder  
9 or alcohol use disorder for veterans with substance-  
10 use dependency who face barriers in accessing sub-  
11 stancce-use recovery services from the Department of  
12 Veterans Affairs.

13 (4) EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION.—The Secretary  
14 shall ensure that, to the extent practicable, grant  
15 amounts awarded under paragraph (1) are equitably  
16 distributed across geographic regions, including  
17 rural and Tribal communities.

18 (5) NOTIFICATION OF SOURCE OF AMOUNTS.—  
19 Each eligible entity awarded a grant under para-  
20 graph (1) shall notify each veteran receiving services  
21 paid for with amounts under such grant that such  
22 services are being paid for, in whole or in part, by  
23 the Department.

24 (6) REPORT ON SERVICES PROVIDED.—The  
25 Secretary shall require each eligible entity awarded

1       a grant under paragraph (1) to submit to the Secretary a report that describes the services provided  
2       or coordinated with amounts under such grant.  
3

4       (d) GRANT APPLICATION.—

5           (1) IN GENERAL.—An eligible entity seeking  
6       the award of a grant under this section shall submit  
7       to the Secretary an application therefor in such  
8       form, in such manner, and containing such commit-  
9       ments and information as the Secretary considers  
10      necessary to carry out this section.

11           (2) CONTENTS OF APPLICATION.—Each appli-  
12       cation submitted by an eligible entity under para-  
13       graph (1) shall contain the following:

14               (A) A description of the recovery services  
15       for substance use disorder or alcohol use dis-  
16       order proposed to be provided by the eligible en-  
17       tity under the pilot program and the identified  
18       need for those services.

19               (B) A description of the types of veterans  
20       with substance use disorder or alcohol use dis-  
21       order proposed to be provided such recovery  
22       services.

23               (C) An estimate of the number of veterans  
24       with substance use disorder or alcohol use dis-

1                   order proposed to be provided such recovery  
2                   services.

3                   (D) Evidence of the experience of the eligi-  
4                   ble entity in providing such recovery services to  
5                   veterans with substance use disorder or alcohol  
6                   use disorder.

7                   (E) A description of the managerial capae-  
8                   ity of the eligible entity—

9                   (i) to assess continually the needs of  
10                   veterans with substance use disorder or al-  
11                   cohol use disorder for such recovery serv-  
12                   ices;

13                   (ii) to coordinate the provision of such  
14                   recovery services with services provided by  
15                   the Department; and

16                   (iii) to tailor such recovery services to  
17                   the needs of veterans with substance use  
18                   disorder or alcohol use disorder.

19                   (3) CRITERIA FOR SELECTION.—

20                   (A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall es-  
21                   tablish criteria for the selection of eligible enti-  
22                   ties to be awarded grants under this section.

23                   (B) ELEMENTS.—Criteria established  
24                   under subparagraph (A) with respect to an eli-  
25                   gible entity shall include the following:

1 (i) Relevant accreditation as may be  
2 required by each State in which the eligible  
3 entity operates.

4 (ii) Experience coordinating care or  
5 providing treatment for veterans or mem-  
6 bers of the Armed Forces.

7 (e) ~~TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.~~

21 (f) **COLLECTION OF INFORMATION.** To the extent  
22 practicable, the Secretary may collect information from an  
23 eligible entity awarded a grant under this section relating  
24 to a substance use disorder or alcohol use disorder of a  
25 veteran participating in the pilot program for inclusion in

1 the electronic health record of the Department for such  
2 veteran for the sole purpose of improving care provided  
3 to such veteran.

4 (g) STUDY ON EFFECTIVENESS OF PILOT PRO-  
5 GRAM.—

6 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall conduct  
7 a study on the effectiveness of the pilot program in  
8 meeting the needs of veterans with substance use  
9 disorder or alcohol use disorder.

10 (2) COMPARISON.—In conducting the study re-  
11 quired by paragraph (1), the Secretary shall com-  
12 pare the results of the pilot program with other pro-  
13 grams of the Department dedicated to the delivery  
14 to veterans of recovery services for substance use  
15 disorder or alcohol use disorder.

16 (3) CRITERIA.—In making the comparison re-  
17 quired by paragraph (2), the Secretary shall examine  
18 the following:

19 (A) The satisfaction of veterans targeted  
20 by the programs described in paragraph (2).

21 (B) The health status of such veterans.

22 (C) The mental wellness of such veterans.

23 (D) The degree to which such programs  
24 encourage such veterans to engage in produc-  
25 tive activity.

(E) The number of veterans using such programs, disaggregated by—

3 (i) veterans who have received care  
4 from the Department during the two-year  
5 period preceding the conduct of the study;  
6 and

10 (F) The number of veterans who are still  
11 homeless or at-risk of homelessness one year  
12 after completion of receipt of recovery services  
13 under such programs.

14 (G) The number of veterans who still have  
15 a substance use disorder or alcohol use disorder  
16 within 180 days of discharge from receipt of  
17 services provided under this section.

25 (h) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1                             (1) **ELIGIBLE ENTITY.**—The term “eligible enti-  
2                             ty” means any of the following:

3                             (A) An incorporated private institution or  
4                             foundation—

5                                 (i) no part of the net earnings of  
6                             which inures to the benefit of any member,  
7                             founder, contributor, or individual;

8                                 (ii) that has a governing board that is  
9                             responsible for the operation of the recov-  
10                             ery services for substance use disorder or  
11                             alcohol use disorder provided under this  
12                             section; and

13                                 (iii) that is approved by the Secretary  
14                             with respect to financial responsibility.

15                             (B) A for-profit limited partnership, the  
16                             sole general partner of which is an organization  
17                             meeting the requirements of subparagraph (A).

18                             (C) A corporation wholly owned and con-  
19                             trolled by an organization meeting the require-  
20                             ments of subparagraph (A).

21                             (D) A tribally designated housing entity  
22                             (as defined in section 4 of the Native American  
23                             Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act  
24                             of 1996 (25 U.S.C. 4103)).

7 SEC. 8. INCREASE AND EXTENSION OF AUTHORIZATION OF  
8 APPROPRIATIONS FOR HOMELESS VETERANS  
9 REINTEGRATION PROGRAMS.

10 Section 2021(e)(1)(F) of title 38, United States  
11 Code, is amended—

15 SEC. 9. PILOT PROGRAM ON GRANTS TO IMPROVE PUBLIC  
16 TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR VETERANS.

17 (a) ~~GRANT PROGRAM REQUIRED.~~ Not later than  
18 one year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the  
19 Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall commence carrying out  
20 a pilot program to assess the feasibility and advisability  
21 of awarding grants to eligible entities to improve public  
22 transportation services for veterans.

23 (b) DURATION.—The Secretary shall carry out the  
24 pilot program during the five-year period beginning on the  
25 date on which the pilot program commences.

## 1       (e) AWARD OF GRANTS.—

2           (1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out the pilot  
3       program, the Secretary shall award grants to eligible  
4       entities to expand, retain, or establish public trans-  
5       portation services that provide veterans access to lo-  
6       cations of facilities or organizations that serve vet-  
7       erans, including—

8           (A) facilities of the Department of Vet-  
9       erans Affairs; and

10           (B) organizations that provide services to  
11       veterans using funds provided by the Depart-  
12       ment.

13           (2) ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.—For purposes of this  
14       section, an eligible entity is any State, Tribal, com-  
15       munity, or city government that—

16           (A) is providing public transportation serv-  
17       ices as of the date on which the pilot program  
18       commences; or

19           (B) has a proven ability and intention to  
20       establish public transportation infrastructure.

21           (3) INTERVALS OF PAYMENT AND MAXIMUM  
22       GRANT AMOUNT.—The Secretary may establish in-  
23       tervals of payment for the administration of grants  
24       under this section and a maximum grant amount to

1       be awarded, in accordance with the services being  
2       provided and the duration of such services.

3            (4) COORDINATION AND CONSULTATION.—In  
4       awarding grants under this section, the Secretary  
5       may coordinate and consult with the Secretary of  
6       Transportation.

7            (5) EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION.—The Secretary  
8       of Veterans Affairs shall ensure that, to the extent  
9       practicable, grants awarded under this section are  
10       equitably distributed across geographic regions, in-  
11       cluding rural and Tribal communities.

12       (d) GRANT APPLICATION.—

13            (1) IN GENERAL.—An eligible entity seeking  
14       the award of a grant under this section shall submit  
15       to the Secretary an application therefor in such  
16       form, in such manner, and containing such commit-  
17       ments and information as the Secretary considers  
18       necessary to carry out this section.

19            (2) CONTENTS OF APPLICATION.—Each appli-  
20       cation submitted by an eligible entity under para-  
21       graph (1) shall contain the following:

22                  (A) A description of the public transpor-  
23       tation services that the entity intends to provide  
24       under the grant.

(B) A list of all sites accessed by the public transportation services to be provided.

3 (C) The schedule of such services.

7 (E) An estimate of the number of veterans  
8 that would use such services.

9 (F) Evidence of the ability of the entity to  
10 provide such services.

11 (e) **NOTIFICATION TO VETERANS.**—Each eligible en-  
12 tity awarded a grant under this section shall notify vet-  
13 erans of the expansion or establishment of public transpor-  
14 tation services to locations of facilities or organizations  
15 that serve veterans and that those services are available  
16 in whole or in part due to funds provided by the Depart-  
17 ment.

18 (f) REPORT ON SERVICES PROVIDED.—The See-  
19 retary shall require each eligible entity awarded a grant  
20 under this section to submit to the Secretary a report that  
21 describes the expansion, retention, or establishment of  
22 public transportation services provided with amounts  
23 under such grant.

24 (g) REPORT

1                   (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year  
2                   after the date on which the first grant is awarded  
3                   under this section, the Secretary shall submit to the  
4                   Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and  
5                   the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of  
6                   Representatives a report on the services provided  
7                   under the pilot program.

8                   (2) ELEMENTS.—The report required by para-  
9                   graph (1) shall include the following:

10                   (A) The geographic location of each recipi-  
11                   ent of a grant under this section.

12                   (B) The estimated number of veterans  
13                   served by each such grant recipient.

14                   (C) An assessment of whether use of facili-  
15                   ties of the Department has increased due to ac-  
16                   cess to public transportation provided under  
17                   grants awarded under this section, if informa-  
18                   tion for such an assessment is available.

19                   **SEC. 10. PILOT PROGRAM ON GRANTS FOR EL-  
20                   DERLY HOMELESS VETERANS.**

21                   (a) PILOT PROGRAM REQUIRED.—Not later than one  
22                   year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-  
23                   retary of Veterans Affairs shall commence carrying out a  
24                   pilot program to assess the feasibility and advisability of  
25                   awarding grants to eligible entities to meet the health care

1 needs of elderly veterans who were previously homeless  
2 and are transitioning to permanent housing.

3 (b) AWARD OF GRANTS.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out the pilot  
5 program, the Secretary shall award grants to eligible  
6 entities for the purpose described in subsection (a).

7 (2) ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.—For purposes of this  
8 section, an eligible entity is any organization that is  
9 successfully providing transitional housing services  
10 using amounts provided by the Secretary under sec-  
11 tions 2012 and 2061 of title 38, United States Code,  
12 as of the date on which the entity applies for a grant  
13 under this section.

14 (3) INTERVALS OF PAYMENT AND MAXIMUM  
15 GRANT AMOUNT.—The Secretary may establish in-  
16 tervals of payment for the administration of grants  
17 under this section and a maximum grant amount to  
18 be awarded, in accordance with the services being  
19 provided by staff hired using grant amounts and the  
20 duration of such services.

21 (4) EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION.—The Secretary  
22 shall ensure that, to the extent practicable, grant  
23 amounts awarded under paragraph (1) are equitably  
24 distributed across geographic regions, including  
25 rural and Tribal communities.

1        (e) USE OF GRANT AMOUNTS.—The recipient of a  
2 grant under the pilot program—

3            (1) shall use grant amounts for the hiring of  
4 nursing staff to care for elderly veterans requiring  
5 assistance with activities of daily living who were  
6 previously homeless and are transitioning to perma-  
7 nent housing; and

8            (2) may use such amounts for supplies and in-  
9 frastructure needs associated with the duties of such  
10 staff.

11        (d) REPORT ON SERVICES PROVIDED.—The Sec-  
12 retary shall require each eligible entity awarded a grant  
13 under this section to submit to the Secretary a report that  
14 describes the services provided or coordinated with  
15 amounts under such grant.

16        (e) DURATION.—The Secretary shall carry out the

21           “(g) REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—(1) Not less frequently  
22        than every two years, the Secretary of Labor shall submit  
23        to Congress a report on the programs conducted under this  
24        section. The Secretary of Labor shall include in the report  
25        the following:

1           “(A) An evaluation of services furnished to veterans under this section.

3           “(B) An analysis of the information collected  
4           under subsection (c).

5           “(2) Not later than 180 days after the end of the program year that begins after the date of the enactment of  
6           the Building Solutions for Veterans Experiencing Homelessness Act of 2021, and not later than 120 days after the  
7           end of each program year thereafter, the Secretary of Labor  
8           shall submit to the Committee on Veterans’ Affairs of the  
9           House of Representatives and the Committee on Veterans’  
10           Affairs of the Senate a report setting forth the following:

13           “(A) Data obtained from the reports submitted  
14           under subsection (f), disaggregated by geographic location.

16           “(B) The number of grants and contracts not awarded under this section due to insufficient funds.

18           “(C) The number of returning recipients of grants or contracts that were and were not awarded grants or contracts under this section during the most recent application cycle.

22           “(D) The number of applications received from entities in States in which no entities received a grant or contract under this section.

1           “(E) The number of veterans who were admitted  
2        to a program conducted under this section but not  
3        placed in a job following participation in such pro-  
4        gram, disaggregated by geographic location, age, gen-  
5        der, and race or ethnicity.

6        “(h) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—(1)

7        There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this  
8        section amounts as follows:

9           “(A) \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 2002.

10          “(B) \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 2003.

11          “(C) \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 2004.

12          “(D) \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 2005.

13          “(E) \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 2006.

14          “(F) \$50,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2007  
15        through 2021.

16          “(G) \$60,000,000 for fiscal year 2022 and each  
17        fiscal year thereafter.

18          “(2) Funds appropriated to carry out this section shall  
19        remain available until expended. Funds obligated in any  
20        fiscal year to carry out this section may be expended in  
21        that fiscal year and the succeeding fiscal year.”.

22          (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 2021A(e) of  
23        title 38, United States Code, is amended by striking “sec-

1   **SEC. 9. PILOT PROGRAM ON GRANTS TO IMPROVE PUBLIC**  
2                   **TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR VETERANS.**

3       (a) *GRANT PROGRAM REQUIRED.*—Not later than one  
4   year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-  
5   retary of Veterans Affairs shall commence carrying out a  
6   pilot program to assess the feasibility and advisability of  
7   awarding grants to eligible entities to improve public trans-  
8   portation services for veterans.

9       (b) *DURATION.*—The Secretary shall carry out the  
10   pilot program during the five-year period beginning on the  
11   date on which the pilot program commences.

12       (c) *LOCATIONS.*—The Secretary shall carry out the  
13   pilot program at not fewer than five locations selected by  
14   the Secretary for purposes of the pilot program.

15       (d) *AWARD OF GRANTS.*—

16           (1) *IN GENERAL.*—In carrying out the pilot pro-  
17   gram, the Secretary shall award grants to eligible en-  
18   tities to expand, retain, or establish public transpor-  
19   tation services that provide veterans access to loca-  
20   tions of facilities or organizations that serve veterans,  
21   including—

22                   (A) facilities of the Department of Veterans  
23   Affairs; and

24                   (B) organizations that provide services to  
25   veterans using funds provided by the Depart-  
26   ment.

(B) has a proven ability and intention to establish public transportation infrastructure.

25 (e) GRANT APPLICATION —

1                   (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*An eligible entity seeking the*  
2                   *award of a grant under this section shall submit to*  
3                   *the Secretary an application therefor in such form, in*  
4                   *such manner, and containing such commitments and*  
5                   *information as the Secretary considers necessary to*  
6                   *carry out this section.*

7                   (2) *CONTENTS OF APPLICATION.*—*Each applica-*  
8                   *tion submitted by an eligible entity under paragraph*  
9                   *(1) shall contain the following:*

10                   (A) *A description of the public transpor-*

12                   *under the grant.*

13                   (B) *A list of all sites accessed by the public*  
14                   *transportation services to be provided.*

15                   (C) *The schedule of such services.*

16                   (D) *A list of the locations of facilities and*  
17                   *organizations that serve veterans that will be*  
18                   *accessed by such services.*

19                   (E) *An estimate of the number of veterans*  
20                   *that would use such services.*

21                   (F) *Evidence of the ability of the entity to*  
22                   *provide such services.*

23                   (f) *NOTIFICATION TO VETERANS.*—*Each eligible entity*  
24                   *awarded a grant under this section shall notify veterans*  
25                   *of the expansion or establishment of public transportation*

1 services to locations of facilities or organizations that serve  
2 veterans and that those services are available in whole or  
3 in part due to funds provided by the Department.

4 (g) REPORT ON SERVICES PROVIDED.—The Secretary  
5 shall require each eligible entity awarded a grant under this  
6 section to submit to the Secretary a report that describes  
7 the expansion, retention, or establishment of public trans-  
8 portation services provided with amounts under such grant.

9 (h) REPORT.—

10 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after  
11 the date on which the first grant is awarded under  
12 this section, the Secretary shall submit to the Com-  
13 mittee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the  
14 Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Rep-  
15 resentatives a report on the services provided under  
16 the pilot program.

17 (2) ELEMENTS.—The report required by para-  
18 graph (1) shall include the following:

19 (A) The geographic location of each recipi-  
20 ent of a grant under this section.

21 (B) The estimated number of veterans  
22 served by each such grant recipient.

23 (C) An assessment of whether use of facili-  
24 ties of the Department has increased due to ac-

3   **SEC. 10. PILOT PROGRAM ON GRANTS FOR HEALTH CARE**  
4           **FOR HOMELESS VETERANS.**

5           *(a) PILOT PROGRAM REQUIRED.—Not later than one*  
6   *year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-*  
7   *retary of Veterans Affairs shall commence carrying out a*  
8   *pilot program to assess the feasibility and advisability of*  
9   *awarding grants to eligible entities to meet the health care*  
10   *needs of—*

11           *(1) veterans who are homeless;*  
12           *(2) veterans who were previously homeless and*  
13           *are transitioning to permanent housing; and*  
14           *(3) veterans who are at risk of becoming home-*  
15           *less.*

16           *(b) LOCATIONS.—The Secretary shall carry out the*  
17   *pilot program at not fewer than five locations selected by*  
18   *the Secretary for purposes of the pilot program.*

19           *(c) AWARD OF GRANTS.—*

20           *(1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out the pilot pro-*  
21   *gram, the Secretary shall award grants to eligible en-*  
22   *tities for the purpose described in subsection (a).*

23           *(2) ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.—For purposes of this*  
24   *section, an eligible entity is any organization that is*  
25   *successfully providing transitional housing services to*

1       *veterans as of the date on which the entity applies for*  
2       *a grant under this section.*

3           *(3) PREFERENCE.—In awarding grants under*  
4       *this section, the Secretary shall give preference to eli-*  
5       *gible entities that are successfully providing transi-*  
6       *tional housing services using amounts provided by the*  
7       *Secretary under sections 2012 and 2061 of title 38,*  
8       *United States Code, as of the date on which the entity*  
9       *applies for a grant under this section.*

10           *(4) INTERVALS OF PAYMENT AND MAXIMUM*  
11       *GRANT AMOUNT.—The Secretary may establish inter-*  
12       *vals of payment for the administration of grants*  
13       *under this section and a maximum grant amount to*  
14       *be awarded, in accordance with the services being*  
15       *provided by staff hired using grant amounts and the*  
16       *duration of such services.*

17           *(5) EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION.—The Secretary*  
18       *shall ensure that, to the extent practicable, grant*  
19       *amounts awarded under paragraph (1) are equitably*  
20       *distributed among eligible entities across geographic*  
21       *regions, including rural and Tribal communities.*

22           *(d) USE OF GRANT AMOUNTS.—The recipient of a*  
23       *grant under the pilot program—*

24           *(1) shall use grant amounts for the hiring of*  
25       *nursing staff to care for veterans described in sub-*

1        *section (a) who require assistance with activities of*  
2        *daily living or need consistent medical attention and*  
3        *monitoring; and*

4            *(2) may use such amounts for supplies and in-*  
5        *frastructure needs associated with the duties of such*  
6        *staff and the needs of such veterans.*

7        *(e) REPORT ON SERVICES PROVIDED.—The Secretary*  
8        *shall require each eligible entity awarded a grant under this*  
9        *section to submit to the Secretary a report that describes*  
10      *the services provided or coordinated with amounts under*  
11      *such grant.*

12        *(f) DURATION.—The Secretary shall carry out the pilot*  
13      *program during the five-year period beginning on the date*  
14      *on which the pilot program commences.*

15        *(g) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—*

16            *(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after*  
17        *the date on which the first grants are awarded under*  
18        *this section, and annually thereafter until the pro-*  
19        *gram terminates, the Secretary shall submit to the*  
20        *Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the*  
21        *Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Rep-*  
22        *resentatives a report on the effectiveness of the pro-*  
23        *gram.*

24            *(2) ELEMENTS.—The report required by para-*  
25        *graph (1) shall include the number of veterans served*

1       *by the pilot program under the care of a staff member*  
2       *the funding for whom is provided by a grant under*  
3       *the program, disaggregated by—*

4               *(A) geographic location;*  
5               *(B) gender;*  
6               *(C) age;*  
7               *(D) race and ethnicity;*  
8               *(E) whether or not a veteran received health*  
9               *care from the Department during the two-year*  
10               *period preceding the date on which the veteran*  
11               *began participating in the program;*  
12               *(F) the number of veterans who transitioned*  
13               *into permanent housing as a result of participa-*  
14               *tion in the program; and*  
15               *(G) with respect to veterans who did not*  
16               *transition into permanent housing as a result of*  
17               *participation in the program, the main reasons*  
18               *for not so transitioning.*

19       **SEC. 11. REPORT BY COMPTROLLER GENERAL OF THE**  
20               **UNITED STATES ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING**  
21               **FOR VETERANS.**

22       *(a) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than three years*  
23       *after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller*  
24       *General of the United States shall submit to the Committee*  
25       *on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on*

1 *Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives a report*  
2 *on the availability of affordable housing for veterans who*  
3 *have or are participating in any program administered by*  
4 *the Homeless Programs Office of the Department of Vet-*  
5 *erans Affairs.*

6       (b) *CONTENTS.—The report required by subsection (a)*  
7 *shall include, with respect to the one-year period preceding*  
8 *the date of the enactment of this Act, the following:*

9           (1) *The number of veterans using housing vouch-  
10       ers under the program carried out under section  
11       8(o)(19) of the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42  
12       U.S.C. 1437f(o)(19)) (commonly referred to as  
13       “HUD–VASH”).*

14           (2) *The number of veterans who were allocated  
15       a housing voucher described in paragraph (1) but who  
16       have been unable to attain permanent housing.*

17           (3) *The number of available housing vouchers de-  
18       scribed in paragraph (1) that are unused for any rea-  
19       son.*

20           (4) *Available data regarding the number of vet-  
21       erans who were discharged from transitional housing  
22       provided using amounts provided under sections 2061  
23       and 2012 of title 38, United States Code, and did not  
24       transition to permanent housing due to a shortage  
25       of—*

5 (C) housing that meets the requirements  
6 and limitations with respect to such vouchers.

7        (c) *DISAGGREGATION.*—The contents of the report de-  
8 scribed in paragraphs (1), (2), and (4) of subsection (b)  
9 shall be disaggregated by veterans with a household income  
10 that does not exceed—
