Collective responsibilities includes clinical care of inpatient and outpatient, as well as undergraduate teaching and training of postgraduate trainees.

The ideal candidate will have comprehensive skills in all aspects of general adult cardiac surgery preferably with a complementary fellowship. We are looking for a fully qualified surgeon able to independently and seamlessly step into a busy cardiac surgical practice well supported by cardiac anesthesiologists, clinical perfusion staff, excellent nursing staff and specialized surgical assistants. Further specialized training in minimally invasive (MIS) mitral valve surgery or Critical Care would be a significant advantage, but not necessary.
