
Let creation become a collective act

The third Río Negro International Art Biennial doesn't arrive in Valcheta as a visitor, because it is already the sound of community that gives meaning to art happening in its territory, in its heart. The BIARN is the heartbeat of that people who, while being, create.

We can say that in this small Patagonian city, art lives, that art that is born in the dirt streets, in the hands that spin, weave, and tell, in the ancient voices that narrate in the wind.

Here, the works are not imposed; they are woven. Between siesta mates and conversations, between laughter and silence, the neighbors become accomplices, workshop leaders, poets of the everyday. The Biennial is no longer an event; it is a shared ritual. Every mural, every installation, every performance bears the mark of those who decided that art is not something that happens, but something we all make happen.

When we thought about holding an Art Biennial in Valcheta, we approached it as a community-based project. After several years of working on artistic, cultural, and heritage activities that focused on social cohesion, identity, and community as a public policy, it allowed us to dream of an event of this nature, of art and community.




Under the theme "Imaginary Heritage, Possible Worlds," this new edition proposes that creation become a collective act. What do we keep in our memory that has not yet happened, of what was not? What futures are sown and born under the poplar trees of a town? Valcheta, a land of myths, stories, legends, and a hand-kneaded present, becomes the territory where the ancient and the yet-to-come merge. The stones hold stories that are not yet written; the stream carries dreams that unrayel on its banks.

This Biennial not only glimpses possible worlds, it builds them collectively. Because heritage is not only what we inherit, but what we create together. In every workshop, in every dialogue, in every shared gesture, there is a future that begins to breathe, and it takes many to bring it about.

Valcheta, a town of wide skies and ancient memories, opens its doors to the world, not to receive, but to offer. Because this Biennial is, above all, an act of trust: the certainty that true art is born where people lend it their hands, their patio, their time, their silence, their love.

In 2026, we meet again. Not as spectators, but as creators of a common pulse. The earth, the stream, the ancient stones of a sleeping tree. Everything becomes canvas. Everything will be poetry.

III Río Negro International Art Biennial BIARN 2026

BIARN is a space for contemporary artistic practices where visual artists, performers, guest curators, and other stakeholders in the art field produce meaning through their connection to the community in its natural and urban environment.

The biennial promotes participatory processes and invites the creation of tangible works or ephemeral actions in the city streets and natural spaces. It also fosters a space for theoretical discussion—thinking about art from the global south—with the construction of reflections that contribute to the phenomenology of situated art.

The participation of artists from different latitudes of the country and abroad is expected, contributing to collective thinking.

All activities will be documented to generate an archive, in addition to producing publications and audiovisual material for dissemination and consultation.



BACKGROUND

From the outset, the biennial set itself the challenge of producing from the people of Valcheta, focusing on community-based creative processes rather than traditional artistic ones, with the intention of positioning new platforms for circulation and thought far from the centers of urban, political, and economic power.

In the first edition (2022), 24 projects were developed by artists and collectives, featuring performances of music, dance, film, and theater, transforming the city into an openair festival.

The second edition (2024) featured multidisciplinary projects and workshops, largely held in family homes, patios, and venues proposed by residents, who quickly embraced the biennial and now eagerly await the third.

OBJECTIVES

General

To hold the third edition of the Río Negro International Biennial of Contemporary Art, with the creation and presentation of artworks, discussions, and workshops focused on "Imaginary Heritage - Possible Worlds," addressing the creative process from the southern part of the world through contemporary practice

Specific

- To strengthen the Río Negro Province Visual Arts Biennial as a platform for creation, reflection, exhibition, and exchange of knowledge in contemporary art, held in the public space of the city of Valcheta, Río Negro.
- Promote new platforms for contemporary art exhibitions and creation in the province of Río Negro.
- Create the First Under the Sky Art Museum in the province of Río Negro in the town of Valcheta.
- Promote spaces for creation and thought that take Patagonia, its geography, and climate as a foundation for identity building.
- Create a written and audiovisual record that will allow for the generation of a memory and theoretical input on art in Río Negro based on the Río Negro Biennial.
- Boost the economy of the city and the region.
- Generate, through art, an inclusive debate in the community that will strengthen Río Negro culture.



ABOUT VALCHETA

It is one of the oldest cities in the southern part of the province of Río Negro. It has approximately 9,000 inhabitants.

Access to Valcheta is via Route 23, which connects Bariloche with Las Grutas, via the Patagonian Train, or Route 4 from the Middle Valley of Río Negro.

A railway branch dating back to April 1910 has been operating and has been a sign of progress for the people of the southern region. It is a local and provincial heritage site and one of the most important means of communication for southern Río Negro.

There are two protected natural areas: the Petrified Forest—the largest in northern Patagonia—located next to the urban sector of the city, and the Somuncura Plateau, a place of great natural and archaeological wealth, 70 km from Valcheta. The city has a farming area and an irrigation system dating back to the 1940s, several of which crisscross the city with irrigation canals and ditches to supply water to the town center.


The city hosts the National Matra and Handicraft Festival. Mapuche vertical weaving and its weavers are one of Valcheta's most important living heritage sites.

It also has a Provincial Museum, a Cultural Center, and decentralized green spaces.

Juan Pablo Montelpare (Valcheta, Río Negro, 1979) is Director of Arts and Community for the Government of the Province of Río Negro. Director of the Río Negro International Art 2024, and Biennial (2022,2026); Vice Mayor of Valcheta (2019-2023). He has participated in contemporary art festivals, exhibitions, meetings, and residencies in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Cuba, Ecuador, and Peru, such as: Nómades, a performance and urban intervention event; Zona de arte en acción (2012); 3rd Trinidad Biennial. Cuba: MOLA Mostra Osso Latinoamericana de Performance 1 and 2; Benteví Residency; Perpendicular, a meeting in the city; Festival Mínimas Residencies; Ecuador/UIO-01 and 02, a contemporary art festival; Guacho Intraterreno, land art 1 and 2; SUDAKA 4 and 5. He has participated as curator and/or director of Latin American and international performance events and exhibitions such as: Lugar Común, an international performance event in the middle of the world, Ecuador; Cochasquí, creative laboratories, Ecuador; MOLA III, Brazil; Espacio Diverso, an international urban intervention event, Ecuador; and Ecuador-Quebec, creative dialogues in action, Ecuador. He has published performance texts in contemporary art spaces in Latin America and Europe.

Virginia Buitrón (Quilmes, Buenos Aires, 1977) is a visual artist and teacher who graduated from the P. Pueyrredón and C. Morel Schools of Fine Arts. She works with the agency of nonhuman organisms. She was awarded the Incentive Prize from the Ministry of Culture of the Province of Santa Fe (2023), the Acquisition Prize for the third best work at the 110th National Salon (2022),

the UNNE Prize (2022), the Honorable Chamber of Senators of the Province of Buenos Aires Prize (2021), and the Kenneth Kemble Grand Prize (2018). She was part of the project The Book of Ten Thousand Things by La Intermundial Holobiente for Documenta 15, where she also OK2022 exhibited the device. She has participated in artist residencies in Argentina, Colombia, and Chile. She has received the FNA Creation Scholarship (2018), the Formadores Scholarship (2021), and the Oxenford Scholarship (2020), among others. She was a judge for the 2023 Kemble Prize. Her work has been exhibited at the Museo Moderno de Buenos Aires, Casa Nacional del Bicentenario, CCK, Museo Rosa Galisteo, MACRO, EAC (Uruguay), and Fundación Fortabat, among others. She is part of the public collections of the Museo de Arte Moderno de Buenos Aires, Palais de Glace, Museo René Brusau, and Museo Petorutti. She lives and works in Quilmes.
