


**Dr. Jerome (Jerry) Schultz** is a former special education teacher. He is currently a Clinical Neuropsychologist, and holds a faculty position at Harvard Medical School. He is the Research Study Coordinator in the BabyBOLD/Gaab Lab-Laboratories of Cognitive Neuroscience at Boston Children's Hospital.

Dr. Schultz was the recipient of the prestigious LDA Award at the 2016 international conference of the Learning Disability Association of America. Dr. Schultz's book "Nowhere to Hide: Why Kids with ADHD and LD Hate School and What We Can Do About It" explores the insidious but pervasive impact of performance-related stress on cognitive functioning and behavior in students with learning and attention problems. Dr. Schultz also writes a blog on The Huffington Post and he has an active following on Twitter. In addition, he writes articles, provides "Expert" answers to questions from parents and teachers, and hosts webinars on the websites of CHADD, LDA, ADDitude Magazine, and [www.understood.org](http://www.understood.org).

Jerry is in schools several days a week, where he works with teachers and other professionals concerned with learning and emotions in kids, in particular, those with learning differences and challenges. His work is based on over 35 years of experience, and he's known for his sensitive, honest and practical advice for teachers, kids and their parents.

Learn why students who have a poor understanding of the conditions that impact learning are under chronic stress, and why this impairs learning. Liberally laced with stress-reducing cartoons and stories that entertain as well as educate, this presentation will provide an overview of the brain systems involved in the stress response, and offer many practical strategies that can stop this self-defeating cycle in its tracks. Dr. Jerome Schultz, a former special education teacher-turned-neuropsychologist, now on the faculty of Harvard Medical School, will talk about the phenomenon of "Saving F.A.S.E." and present the DE-STRESS Model of Intervention introduced in his book: *Nowhere to Hide: Why Kids with ADHD and LD Hate School and What We Can Do About It.*
