

**Receiving the federal Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) will not have an impact on an employer's eligibility for the Canada-Ontario Job Grant (COJG).**

**Employers are still eligible to apply for COJG funding to train their employees!**

Canada-Ontario Job Grant (COJG) provides opportunities for employers, individually or in groups, to invest in their workforce, with help from the government.

MCE has had many employers take advantage of this incentive and successfully enroll employees identified as Future Ready Leaders into our training programs.

### **Important to Know.**

- Employers can get up to \$10,000 in government support per person for training costs.
- The training can be delivered by an eligible, third-party trainer such as MCE
- Employers with 100 or more employees need to contribute 1/2 of the training costs. Small employers with less than 100 employees need to contribute 1/6 of training costs.
- For employer groups who want to apply for training supports the government offers a COJG Consortium Stream. The Consortium Stream allows a group of employers (two or more employers) to pool their resources to support common training objectives and goals.
- Most organizations acting as an intermediary are eligible for administrative funding equal to 15% of the government contribution.
