Address on the occasion of Older Persons Week, by Maria Elena Sylvestre Patroness of HelpAge Belize.

On October 1st each year, in more than 50 countries the communities of HelpAge International pause to pay tribute to our elders. It is a time for celebration and joy as well as a time to reflect and consider how far we have come in achieving the goals set by the United Nations to protect the rights of our seniors. It is my privilege and honor to greet you on behalf of the extended family of HelpAge Belize situated in every district, our capital city, Belmopan, and the villages of Seine Bight and Hopkins.

I take great pride in sharing with you the many ways that our 11 branches fulfill the vision of HelpAge, by caring for, working with, and enjoying sharing the life's experiences of our older persons.

Each branch has its own unique way of serving their members. Under the leadership of Chair Mr. Evan Dakers, and his committed board members, and the hard work of our Executive Director Ms. Ivorine Bulwer and her staff, 2017 and 2018 saw many innovations and improvements in the management and delivery of services. Our two residential homes, Sr. Cecilia and Octavia Waight, continue to work with small resources—but with great results—in their determination to effect constant improvements in their delivery of care to their residents.

Our tribute and recognition this year to an outstanding older person at our annual gala, went to the Right Hon. Dr. Sir Manuel Esquivel, former Prime Minister of Belize. I hark back to that time in our history when the family, its traditions, and values were the bulwark of our society. Children were cherished and disciplined in the home first, grandparents were loved and respected. Through many generations the lores and legends of our culture were handed down from parents to sons and

daughters . These core values, still reside in the hearts and minds of every Belizean. It only needs to be nurtured so it can flourish once again. Our precious country of less than four hundred thousand persons should be able to work together with one goal to make Belize an oasis of peace and tranquility, where young and old can enjoy the true Belizean experience that makes us so uniquely special.

Throughout this week up to October 1st, let us demonstrate just how much we love our parents and grandparents, and how grateful we are to still have them in our lives.
