The American Board of Cosmetic Gynecology (ABCG) awards certification to surgeons who are uniquely qualified to safely perform cosmetic gynecological surgery of the female genital tract as well as nonsurgical aesthetic treatments. We hold our diplomates to the highest, most rigorous benchmarks of training and experience.

There is no weekend course or conference that qualifies ABCG diplomates. Qualifications for challenging the board are some of the most rigorous of any board, requiring years of medical education, surgical training, hands-on experience, and proven aesthetic and functional mastery.

The AAA encourages all members to become certified by the American Board of Cosmetic Gynecology (ABCG)

The American Board of Cosmetic Gynecology (ABCG) prides itself on setting the highest standards for gynecological surgeons. The ABCG board certification is reserved for surgeons who already possess at least one recognized board certificate, complete comprehensive fellowship training in cosmetic gynecology (step 1 and step 2) and pass a rigorous written and oral exam focusing on all aspects of cosmetic surgery.

Requirements to Earn The ABCG Certification

To become an ABCG diplomate, a cosmetic gynecological surgeon must

1. Complete a minimum 12-month, full-time cosmetic gynecology surgery practice.
2. Each candidate should pass Cosmetic gynecology fellowship program organized by the American Aesthetic Association (AAA) both part 1 and part 2 and pass the exam
3. For other candidates who did not attend the American Aesthetic Association (AAA) both part 1 and part 2 there will be a preparatory three



days intensive didactic course to cover all the topics given in such a fellowship. Those delegates must pass an MCQ exam at the conclusion of this review

4. Each candidate should submit 20 cases of non-surgical cosmetic gynecology cases
5. Each candidate should submit 10 cases of surgical cosmetic gynecology cases
6. Have a passing score (70%) on each part of the ABCG EXAM
7. Pass the oral examination
