Inclement Weather Policy

Sandy Mount follows the Carroll County Snow Emergency Plan

If the snow emergency plan is in effect 90 minutes prior to any worship service or **event** at Sandy Mount the services are canceled.

For Sunday Worship:

If the snow emergency plan is in effect at 7:30 am, then 9 & 11 am worship services and Sunday school are **canceled.**

When attending an 11A.M. service a few weeks ago, I was emotionally moved by the display of Prayer Shawls that had been donated. I spoke to Pastor Kathy to express what the Prayer Shawls had come to mean to me, specifically, how much one came to mean to my mother, Rose Matthews. Pastor Kathy has encouraged me to share my sentiments with the church.

My mother, shortly after being placed on hospice, was visited by Kathy Bailey. Kathy is well known to many of you. During her visit, she presented my mother with a Prayer Shawl. My mother very much believed in the power and value of prayer, and that Prayer Shawl remained a comfort to her throughout the rest of her life.

While in hospice care at home, my mother fell and broke her femur. Due to the severity of the injury, she required hospitalization, surgery, and a stay at a rehabilitation center. Eventually, my mother made it back to my house where she peacefully lived the rest of her days. The Prayer Shawl was a source of comfort during very uncomfortable periods and traveled with her from hospital, to rehab, to home, and remains with her today.

Seeing the Prayer Shawls the other morning, reminded me of the love of my mother. I want to express to the church how the Prayer Shawl was a comfort, not only to my mom, but also to me. I want to say Thank You to the church. More importantly, I want to specifically express my deepest gratitude and encouragement to those individuals making and donating the Prayer Shawls because they are a greatly appreciated comfort and blessing.

Capital Campaign for Emergency Repairs

It is with great joy that we can announce that all of the major repair projects that fell upon our church in late 2018 and during 2019 are now completed. Our congregation was asked on several occasions to give generously to our capital campaign to cover the cost of these emergency repairs. **Your generosity was overwhelming.** All repairs have been completed and paid for. The trustees replaced the parsonage roof and the Sunday School wing roof, replaced the water supply piping to the kitchen including a new well pump, replaced the sewage line from the restrooms, and replaced all the overhead lighting in the sanctuary. The total cost for all these emergency projects was over \$50,000. Thank you for your support!
