A Community Singing Workshop with Reggie Harris

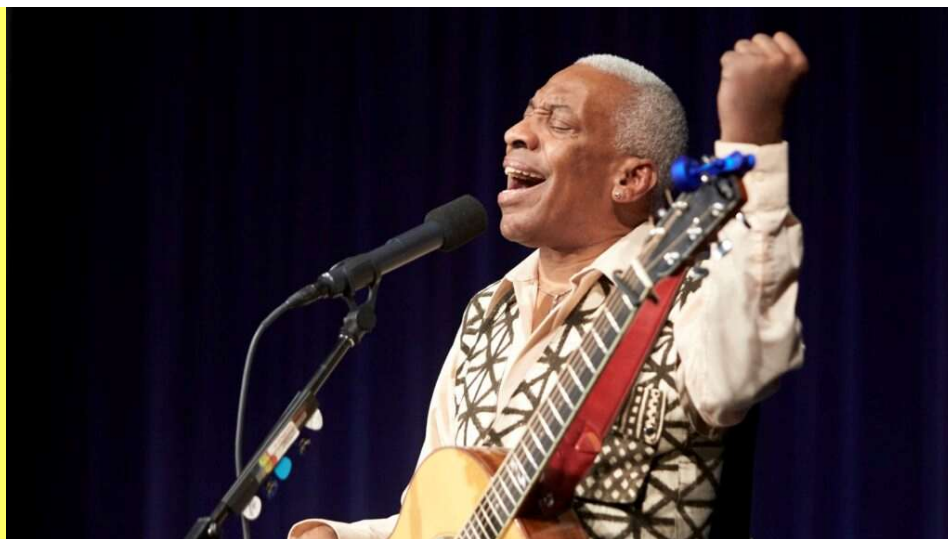
