What is a Saint Joseph's Table?

A parish Saint Joseph's Table is typically a three-tiered display covered with white linen tablecloths. The three tiers represent the Holy Trinity, and the ascent from earth to heaven. A statue of Saint Joseph is placed on the top tier. Tiers might hold flowers (especially lilies), candles, statues and holy cards, and food.

Our Saint Joseph's Table will be a collection of food & alms, continuing the tradition of celebrating God's gifts and sharing resources with the poor. Items brought in over the week will be added to our Saint Joseph's Table before being donated to our local food pantry partners. This table will be located in the elementary school cafeteria.

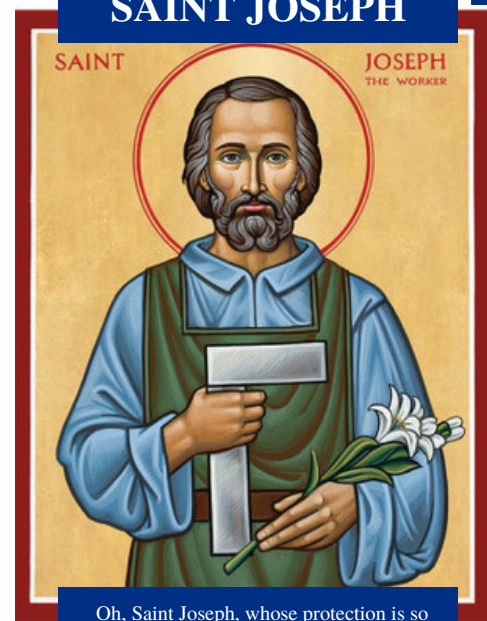
