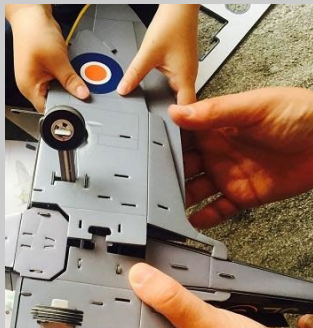

Virtual Reality Program Calls All Ages

When Wapiti's Community Services Librarian took the Virtual Reality Programming Kit to the Melfort Public Library, patrons of all ages enthusiastically responded. The library had advertised the program as being for ages 5 to 99, but everyone was inspired when a 100-year-old patron attended, excited about the chance for a new experience.



The Google Expeditions Virtual Reality program allows simulated exploration outside library walls. Patrons were guided through collections of 360° scenes and 3D objects as they explored Rome, the Moon, Mexico, and the Great Barrier Reef. Multiple sessions were held throughout the day, with approximately 70 patrons enjoying their adventures.

Wapiti's Branch Librarians may book the Virtual Reality programming kit through the Community Services Librarian for use within the library.

Budding Author Debuts First Book at Local Library

In late September, new author Dylan Aarestad (pen name Jarret Madden) was hosted by the Debden Public Library for his first author reading. The event was a means to promote his self-published teen adventure/fantasy novel, *The Road to Blackthrush: The Sixth Order Book 1*.

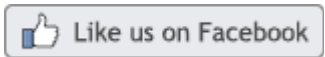
