In mid August, on behalf of SLA, I flew to Toronto and attended The Partnership's annual two day summer retreat. It was great to meet other executive board members and staff and hear updates from Canadian provincial and territorial associations. There is more work to be done and your board is gearing up for an exciting and productive year.

Sara is the recipient of a Category 1 grant to attend a continuing education opportunity and Jennifer is the recipient of a grant to attend the Saskatchewan Association of Library Technicians' fall 2016 workshop in Saskatoon.

Staying on the theme of continuing education, the Partnership coordinates two great programs. The first is the Education Institute (EI) www.educationinstitute.ca. One hour webinars and longer web courses are offered year-round for library workers in all sectors. Reasonably priced sessions are conducted using Adobe Connect and they are archived. Rates are available for single users, groups, and institutions. An institutional rate allows all library workers access to all sessions for one year – it's a great deal! The Partnership also supports the national [Continuing Education Certificate](#) (CEC). It is an excellent tool for library workers to plan and record professional development activities. The one time registration fee is \$40 and at the end of the three year program you receive a certificate documenting your work. Attending and/or hosting an EI session qualify for CEC credit. I'm registered in the program and participation also supports SLA.

Our Board of Directors participated in a retreat Aug. 28-29 at St. Peter's College and Abbey in Meunster, SK. It's a fantastic venue and it provided us with inspiration for developing new ideas for the upcoming year. The next meeting of the Board of Directors is in La Ronge, SK Oct. 2-3 and I'm sure it will be an enriching experience.

Finally SLA will again be offering a province-wide Happy Hour. It's scheduled from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm on Thursday, November 3.
