- How do you get word out about your programming?
 We use social media, calendars, posters in branch as well as posters around town.
- Did you offer this kind of vibrant programming pre-Covid, or has programming expanded over the past year?
 - We have always offered programming free of charge and provided supplies. We are doing more virtual classes now than before and we are now offering more take and make craft kits.
