A key element of the workshop will highlight accessing writers' resources through public libraries. **October 19** 

**Swift Current Public Library** In conjunction with the Saskatchewan German Council, Swift Current Public Library will be celebrating German Heritage in Southwest Saskatchewan Libraries. They will show a film, do storytelling, and a talk about POW camps in Alberta. **October 21**
