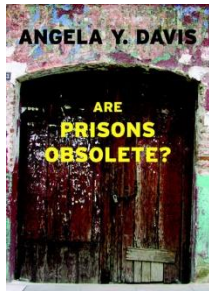


## Join the Right to Read Book Club!
