## Incredible Programming Possibilities for your Library

The Yorkton Film Festival (YFF) is seeking partnerships with Saskatchewan libraries in the organization of screenings to recognize Canada 150 . The films we can offer (without charge) centre on diversity, one of the four themes for the 2017 events.
