# 1) Voting Update

The voting deadline for the 2019 Willow finalists has been extended to **June 1, 2020**. We would like to encourage teachers, librarians and parents to please collect as many votes as possible and submit them on our website.

We will announce the winners over three days; the Shining Willow winner on **June 16th**, the Diamond Willow winner on **June 17th**, and the Snow Willow winner on **June 18th**.

We hope that children and youth around the province will be able to vote either through their classroom teachers and teacher-librarians or from home with the help of their parents.

#### 2) The 2020 Willow Awards Gala Has Been Cancelled

With our voting deadline extended and the continued uncertainty around COVID-19 and social distancing, we are unable to celebrate with the 2020 Willow Awards Gala that was to be held at Wilfred Hunt School in Regina on May 29, 2020.
