Imagine a World where Every Librarian Added One More Reference to Wikipedia.

[Wikimedia Canada](#) invites you to join the global [#1lib1ref campaign](#) from January 15 to February 5, 2020, and contribute to the largest free online encyclopedia created and edited by volunteers. This campaign is part of the [Wikimedia Foundation's GLAM](#) outreach strategy to involve and train librarians in the improvement of Wikipedia.

How can you get involved?

1. **Make an edit!** The simplest way to contribute is by clicking on the edit tab on the top-right corner of any page and dive right in. No account needed! Make sure you **include the hashtag #1Lib1Ref** in the edit summary to have it included in the campaign! You can always [create a Wikipedia account](#) later.
2. **Don't know where to start?** Check out the [Citation Hunt tool](#), which will serve up randomly selected snippets of pages that have been identified as "citation needed". Other powerful ways to participate can be by improving citation information or finding [open-source alternatives](#) for cited articles.
3. **Prefer to join a group in person?** If you're in the Edmonton area, the University of Alberta Library is [organizing a short workshop](#) and group editing session on Thursday, January 30, 2020, from 3:30 pm - 5:00 pm.
