Red Light intentional academic time set apart with your child Example: Learning to do Math at Home with Stacy Greener on YouTube	Hunt for words Materials: sticky notes/ paper, dry eraser board, pictures of objects. Directions: Parent and child can write simple words on a paper. Parent will hide them for the child to find. Parent will encourage child to identify words.	Basket Counting Materials: a basket or small box, beans, buttons, pasta for counting. Directions: Talk about what they have in the basket. Have them count how many they have. Ask the child to take one item take out, two and so one. Have them take one item out at a time, adding them together and counting them again.	Rhyming words Materials: writing paper, crayons, markers, and pencils. Directions: Parent will say one word and the child will come up with their own rhyming word. Child will be encouraged to write his word.	Counting Cards Materials: paper, marker, buttons or pennies Directions: Number the paper 1-5 to the left side of the paper, draw dots on the right side corresponding to the number on the left, then have your child place pennies or buttons on the dots. Make sure to count along the way with them.	News Paper Activity Provide your child newspaper and index cards that have words on it, so that your child knows what letters they need to look for in the newspaper. Have your child cut out letters from the newspaper. They can glue the letters they cut out on a blank piece paper to form new words.
Yellow Light purposeful activities spread throughout the day <u>ABCmouse</u> (use code SCHOOL1446)	Parents can create sock puppets (or any other items) with children and create a story line with them. Children will use a variety of words and parents can also provide new vocabulary words.	Title: Counting flowers Materials: Paper & pencil Directions: Have children locate flowers in the back or front yard or as you take a walk. Your child or you can draw a flower each time you see spot them. When your done sit down and count how many flowers are on your paper. How many different flowers did you find? How many of the same?	Title: Reading Keep some books in different areas of your home that you think your child might be interested in. If they're accessible to your child, you'll be more familiar with books and motivate them to read.	Sorting Laundry Materials: Laundry Directions: Have children sort out laundry by color, shapes, or size.	Identification of traffic signals Go for a walk and point out the letters on the signs, such as the stop symbol  . Saying the letters and then reading the word. When you see another sign, see if your child can identify the letters and help him as he reads the sign. Explains the meaning of each signal you look at.
