

Aligned Priority Bill Update—Kansas

Student Well-Being & School Environment

***Senate* Bell-to-Bell Cell Phone Ban**

[S Sub for HB 2299](#) - Requiring school districts to prohibit the use of personal electronic communication devices during instructional time and prohibiting any employee of a school district from using social media to directly communicate with any student for official school purposes.

- Passed the Senate 32-4; Sent to House for motion to concur

***House* Bell-to-Bell Cell Phone Ban**

[House Sub for SB 281](#) - Requiring school districts to prohibit the use of personal electronic communication devices during school hours, prohibiting any employee of a school district from using social media to directly communicate with any student for official school purposes and requiring school districts to report on the amount of screen time that certain students experience during a typical school day.

- House: Passed House 75-48
- Senate: Ruled “Materially Altered” (reverted back to base bill)

Age-appropriate School Device Act

[SB 350](#) - Enacting the age-appropriate school device act to establish safety standards and requirements for the use of school-issued devices in certain grade levels and authorizing parents to opt students out of certain uses of such devices.

ACT WorkKeys

[HB 2530](#) - *Substitute for HB 2530 by Committee on Education - Providing for the transferability of credentials earned through ACT workkeys career readiness assessments towards a degree.*

Special Education Teacher Training Pilot

[SB 440](#) - *Authorizing a special education pilot program that provides provisional accreditation to a private entity for the purpose of operating a special education teacher training program, allowing such entity to collect data from such program and providing requirements for full accreditation of such program.*

Kansas Blueprint for Literacy Implementation

SB 517 - *Expanding the every child can read act reporting requirements and amending the Kansas blueprint for literacy to provide certain requirements for the state board of education, the state board of regents and school districts with regard to literacy education and reporting.*

Transparency and Accountability

Longitudinal Student Achievement & Assessment Flexibility

HB 2482 - *modernizes Kansas's student assessment policy while reinforcing the state's commitment to longitudinal student achievement data.*

- House: Passed House 121-1
- Hearing March 10 in Senate Education

Foster Care School Choice and Record Transfer

HB 2320 - *Authorizing children in the custody of the secretary of the department for children and families to attend school in any school district, requiring records for such students to be timely transferred between school districts and requiring a transportation plan if the child remains in the school of origin.*

- House: Passed House 122-0
- Hearing March 11 in Senate Education

Federal Funds Reporting Requirement

HB 2618 - *Requiring the state board of education to report to the legislature on federal moneys that are received by the state.*

HB 2663 - *Modifying the requirements for student cohorts and achievement goals for*

Teacher Background Checks

[SB 246](#) - *Requiring all applicants for teaching licenses and certificates and employees of a school district or public innovative district to submit to a criminal history record check and creating the criminal history record check reimbursement fund for certain state and criminal history record checks conducted by the Kansas department for aging and disability services.*

30 Minute Recess Requirement

[SB 339](#) - *Requiring school districts to provide at least 30 minutes of daily recess time for students in grades kindergarten through five and designating such time as part of the school term.*

Amending the KS Promise Scholarship Act

[SB 340](#) - *Prohibiting promise scholarship awards from being used to fund corequisite courses.*

Postsecondary Course Agreements

[SB341](#) - *Providing requirements for agreements between a school district and a postsecondary educational institution for the provision of postsecondary courses taught in secondary schools.*

Extension of the 2027 Sunset for the School Finance Formula

[SB342](#) - *Extending the expiration date of the Kansas school equity and enhancement act from 2027 to 2028*

Parental Consent for Mental Health Services

[HB 2420](#) - *Requiring school districts to obtain parental consent prior to providing certain school-based mental health services to a student.*

Potty Training Bill

[HB 2486](#) - *Requiring children to be toilet trained to enroll in and attend kindergarten in any public school and providing certain exceptions thereto.*

Teacher Support Bill

[HB 2673](#) - *Establishing the positive learning environment act to provide for certain rights for teachers and require school districts to adopt school management plans to address behavioral infractions by students.*
